SECTION 1. Section 1701.404, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

CERTIFICATION OF OFFICERS FOR MENTAL HEALTH Sec. 1701.404. (a) The commission by rule may establish minimum ASSIGNMENTS. requirements for the training, testing, and certification of special officers for offenders with mental impairments.

(b) The commission may certify a sheriff, sheriff's deputy, constable, $[\frac{or}{a}]$ other peace officer, county jailer, or $[\frac{a}{a}]$ justice of the peace $[\frac{r}{a}]$ as a special officer for offenders with mental impairments if the person [officer]:

(1) completes a training course in emergency first aid

and lifesaving techniques approved by the commission;

(2) completes a training course administered by the commission on mental health issues and offenders with mental impairments; and

(3)an examination administered bу the passes commission that is designed to test the <u>person's</u> [officer's]:

recognition of (A) knowledge and and symptoms of characteristics mental illness, mental retardation, and mental disabilities; and

(B) knowledge of mental health crisis intervention strategies for people with mental impairments.

(c) The commission may issue a professional achievement or proficiency certificate to an officer, county jailer, or justice of the peace who meets the requirements of Subsection (b).

SECTION 2. (a) The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education may certify a county jailer as a special officer for offenders with mental impairments and may issue a certificate to the county jailer if the county jailer meets the requirements of Subsection (b), Section 1701.404, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, regardless of whether the county jailer completed the required training and passed the examination

before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

(b) The Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education may issue a certificate under Subsection (c), Section 1701.404, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, to a justice of the peace who is certified as a special officer for offenders with mental impairments regardless of whether the justice of the peace was certified before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
