A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to programs and funding to support adult and postsecondary 3 education and workforce development at public junior colleges and public technical institutes. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 3, Education Code, is amended 7 by adding Chapter 134 to read as follows: CHAPTER 134. POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AND 8 9 EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS SUBCHAPTER A. JOBS AND EDUCATION FOR TEXANS (JET) 10 11 GRANT PROGRAM 12 Sec. 134.001. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "public junior college" and "public technical institute" have the meanings 13 14 assigned by Section 61.003. Sec. 134.002. JOBS AND EDUCATION FOR TEXANS (JET) FUND. 15 (a) The comptroller shall establish and administer the Jobs and 16 Education for Texans (JET) fund as a dedicated account in the 17 general revenue fund. 18 (b) The following amounts shall be deposited in the fund: 19 (1) any amounts appropriated by the legislature for 20 21 the fund for purposes of this subchapter; 22 (2) interest earned on the investment of money in the 23 fund; and 24 (3) gifts, grants, and other donations received for

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| 2 | Sec. 134.003. ADVISORY BOARD. (a) An advisory board of |
| 3 | education and workforce stakeholders is created to assist the |
| 4 | comptroller in administering this chapter. |
| 5 | (b) The advisory board is composed of seven members who |
| 6 | serve two-year terms and are appointed as follows: |
| 7 | (1) one member appointed by the governor; |
| 8 | (2) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor; |
| 9 | (3) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of |
| 10 | representatives; |
| 11 | (4) one member appointed by the Texas Higher Education |
| 12 | Coordinating Board; |
| 13 | (5) one member appointed by the Texas Workforce |
| 14 | Commission; |
| 15 | (6) one member of the public appointed by the |

| 22 | PROGRAM. The comptroller shall establish and administer the Jobs |
| 23 | and Education for Texans (JET) Grant Program to provide grants to |
| 24 | public junior colleges and public technical institutes that apply |
| 25 | to the advisory board in the manner prescribed by the advisory |
| 26 | board. The comptroller shall award the grants on the advice and |
| 27 | recommendations of the advisory board. Grants may be awarded under |

| 1 | this subchapter from the JET fund for the following purposes: |
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| 2 | (1) to expand and support programs that meet the |
| 3 | requirements of Section 134.005 and that prepare low-income |
| 4 | students for careers in high-demand occupations; |

| 11 | Sec. 134.005. GRANTS FOR INNOVATIVE AND SUCCESSFUL |
| 12 | PROGRAMS. (a) The comptroller may award a grant for the |
| 13 | development of programs to prepare low-income students for careers |
| 14 | in high-demand occupations. |
| 15 | (b) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a |
| 16 | program must: |
| 17 | (1) provide assistance to those students in preparing |
| 18 | for, applying to, and enrolling in a public junior college or public |
| 19 | technical institute; and |
| 20 | (2) demonstrate to the satisfaction of the advisory |
| 21 | board: |
| 22 | (A) above average completion of developmental |
| 23 | education among participating public junior college or public |
| 24 | technical institute students; |
| 25 | (B) above average persistence rates among |
| 26 | participating public junior college or public technical institute |
| 27 | students; |

No. 1312 1 (C) above average certificate or degree completion rates by participating students within a three-year 2 period compared to demographically comparable public junior 3 college and public technical institute students; and 4 5 (D) employment of participating students at an average full-time starting wage that is equal to or greater than 6 7 the prevailing wage for the occupation entered. 8 (c) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a public junior college or <u>public technical institute must provide</u> 9 matching funds in accordance with rules adopted under Section 10 134.008. The matching funds may be obtained from any source 11 12 available to the college or institute, including in-kind contributions, community or foundation grants, individual 13 14 contributions, and local governmental agency operating funds. 15 (d) Grants awarded under this section must be awarded in a manner that takes a balanced geographical distribution into 16 17 consideration. Sec. 134.006. FUNDING FOR CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION 18 19 PROGRAMS. (a) The comptroller may award a grant for the development of new career and technical education courses or 20 programs at public junior colleges and public technical institutes. 21 (b) A grant received under this section may be used only: 22 (1) to support courses or programs that prepare 23 24 students for career employment in occupations that are identified by local businesses as being in high demand; 25 26 (2) to finance initial costs of career and technical education course or program development, including the costs of 27

| 1 | constructing or renovating facilities, purchasing equipment, and |
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| 2 | other expenses associated with the development of a new course; and |
| 3 | (3) to finance a career and technical education course |
| 4 | or program that leads to a license, certificate, or postsecondary |
| 5 | degree. |
| 6 | (c) In awarding a grant under this section, the comptroller |
| 7 | shall primarily consider the potential economic returns to the |
| 8 | state from the development of the career and technical education |
| 9 | course or program, and may consider whether the course or program is |
| 10 | part of a new, emerging industry or high-demand occupation. |
| 11 | (d) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a |
| 12 | public junior college or public technical institute must provide |
| 13 | matching funds in accordance with rules adopted under Section |
| 14 | 134.008. The matching funds may be obtained from any source |
| 15 | available to the college, including in-kind contributions, |
| 16 | industry consortia, community or foundation grants, individual |
| 17 | contributions, and local governmental agency operating funds. |
| 18 | Sec. 134.007. SCHOLARSHIPS. (a) The comptroller may award |
| 19 | a scholarship to a public junior college or public technical |
| 20 | institute student. |
| 21 | (b) To be eligible to receive a scholarship under this |
| 22 | section, a student must: |
| 23 | (1) demonstrate financial need; and |
| 24 | (2) be enrolled in a training program for a |
| 25 | high-demand occupation, as determined by the comptroller on the |
| 26 | recommendation of the advisory board. |
| 27 | Sec. 134.008. RULES. The comptroller shall adopt rules as |
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| 1 | necessary for the administration of this subchapter. |
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| 2 | SECTION 2. Section 29.255, Education Code, is amended by |
| 3 | adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: |
| 4 | (c) The agency shall allocate funds under this section to |
| 5 | the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board in an amount |
| 6 | sufficient for the development, implementation, and administration |
| 7 | of the adult basic education pilot program established under |
| 8 | <u>Section 61.0764.</u> |
| 9 | SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is |
| 10 | amended by adding Section 61.0764 to read as follows: |
| 11 | Sec. 61.0764. ADULT BASIC EDUCATION PILOT PROGRAM. (a) In |
| 12 | this section, "pilot program" means the adult basic education pilot |
| 13 | program established under this section. |
| 14 | (b) Using funds received under Section 29.255(c), the board |
| 15 | by rule shall establish a pilot program under which participating |
| 16 | junior college districts receive funding to establish adult |
| 17 | education programs that focus on: |
| 18 | (1) the provision of developmental education to |
| 19 | support the transition from high school to college or a career; and |
| 20 | (2) dropout recovery. |
| 21 | (c) To participate in the pilot program, a junior college |
| 22 | district must apply to the board in the manner prescribed by the |
| 23 | board. The application must include a detailed plan developed by |
| 24 | the junior college district for the district's adult education |
| 25 | program. The board may select for participation in the pilot |
| 26 | program those junior college districts whose plans serve the |
| 27 | purposes of the pilot program as determined by the board. |

S.B. No. 1312 1 <u>(d) The board may adopt rules necessary to administer this</u> 2 <u>section.</u>

3 SECTION 4. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 4 shall adopt the rules required by Section 61.0764, Education Code, 5 as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after this Act takes 6 effect. For that purpose, the coordinating board may adopt the 7 initial rules in the manner provided by law for emergency rules.

8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
