A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of acupuncture.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 205.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subdivision (2) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (2) "Acupuncture" means:
- 8 (A) the [nonsurgical, nonincisive] insertion of
- 9 an acupuncture needle and the application of moxibustion to
- 10 specific areas of the human body as a primary mode of therapy to
- 11 treat and mitigate a human condition, including evaluation and
- 12 assessment of the condition; and
- 13 (B) the administration or recommendation of
- 14 thermal or electrical treatments or [the recommendation] of dietary
- 15 guidelines, energy flow exercise, or dietary or herbal supplements
- 16 in conjunction with the treatment described by Paragraph (A).
- 17 (2-a) "Acupuncture" does not include surgery or
- 18 clinical needle electromyography.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 205.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 205.003. EXEMPTION; LIMITATION. (a) This chapter
- 22 does not apply to a physician [health care professional licensed
- 23 under another statute of this state and acting within the scope of
- 24 the license].

- 1 (b) This chapter does not:
- 2 (1) limit the practice of medicine by a physician,
- 3 including the delegation and supervision of medical acts by a
- 4 physician;
- 5 (2) permit the unauthorized practice of medicine; or
- 6 (3) permit a person to dispense, administer, or supply
- 7 a controlled substance, narcotic, or dangerous drug [unless the
- 8 person is authorized by other law to do so].
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 205.060, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 205.060. APPLICATION OF OPEN MEETINGS, OPEN RECORDS,
- 12 AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE LAWS. (a) Except as provided by
- 13 this chapter, the acupuncture board is subject to Chapters 551,
- 14 552, and 2001, Government Code.
- 15 (b) The acupuncture board may hear all evidence and
- 16 arguments and conduct deliberations relating to license
- 17 applications and disciplinary actions under this chapter in
- 18 executive sessions. The board shall vote and announce its
- 19 decisions in open session. Deliberations by the board relating to
- 20 license applications and disciplinary actions are exempt from
- 21 Chapter 551, Government Code.
- SECTION 4. Section 205.101, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 23 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 24 as follows:
- 25 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d) [Subject to the
- 26 advice and approval of the medical board], the acupuncture board
- 27 shall:

- 1 (1) establish qualifications for an acupuncturist to
- 2 practice in this state;
- 3 (2) establish minimum education and training
- 4 requirements necessary for the acupuncture board to [recommend that
- 5 the medical board] issue a license to practice acupuncture;
- 6 (3) administer an examination that is validated by
- 7 independent testing professionals for a license to practice
- 8 acupuncture;
- 9 (4) develop requirements for licensure by endorsement
- 10 of other states;
- 11 (5) prescribe the application form for a license to
- 12 practice acupuncture;
- 13 (6) [recommend rules to] establish licensing and other
- 14 fees; and
- 15 (7) adopt [establish the requirements for a tutorial
- 16 program for acupuncture students who have completed at least 48
- 17 semester hours of college; and
- 18 [(8) recommend] additional rules as are necessary to
- 19 administer and enforce this chapter.
- 20 (b) In establishing minimum education and training
- 21 requirements under Subsection (a)(2), the acupuncture board shall
- 22 consider the minimum education and training standards established
- 23 by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental
- 24 Medicine.
- 25 (d) A rule relating to the scope of practice of acupuncture
- 26 must have the advice and approval of the medical board. [The
- 27 acupuncture board does not have independent rulemaking authority.

- 1 A rule adopted by the acupuncture board is subject to medical board
- 2 approval.
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 205.103, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 205.103. FEES. The acupuncture [medical] board shall
- 6 set [and collect] fees in amounts that are reasonable and necessary
- 7 to cover the costs of administering and enforcing this chapter,
- 8 including the costs for the medical board to collect the fees,
- 9 without the use of any [other] funds generated by the medical board.
- 10 SECTION 6. Section 205.201, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 205.201. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) Except as provided by
- 13 Section 205.303, a person may not practice or represent that the
- 14 person practices acupuncture in this state unless the person holds
- 15 a license to practice acupuncture issued by the acupuncture board
- 16 under this chapter.
- 17 (b) A person practices acupuncture if the person performs,
- 18 offers to perform, or attempts to perform acupuncture.
- 19 (c) A person represents that the person practices
- 20 acupuncture if the person:
- 21 (1) uses in connection with the person's name or
- 22 business activity:
- 23 (A) the word "acupuncturist" or "acupuncture";
- 24 (B) the letters or abbreviation "L.Ac." or
- 25 "Lic.Ac."; or
- (C) any other words, letters, abbreviations, or
- 27 insignia indicating or implying that the person is an

- 1 acupuncturist; or
- 2 (2) directly or by implication represents to the
- 3 public that the person is an acupuncturist or that the person
- 4 provides acupuncture.
- 5 (d) This section does not apply to a physician or a person
- 6 acting under the delegation and supervision of a physician.
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 205.204, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 205.204. APPLICATION FOR EXAMINATION. An application
- 10 for examination must be:
- 11 (1) in writing on a form prescribed by the acupuncture
- 12 board;
- 13 (2) verified by affidavit;
- 14 (3) filed with the executive director; and
- 15 (4) accompanied by a fee in an amount set by the
- 16 acupuncture [medical] board.
- SECTION 8. Section 205.208, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 205.208. TEMPORARY LICENSE. The acupuncture board may
- 20 adopt rules and recommend to the medical board fees relating to
- 21 granting temporary licenses and extending the expiration dates of
- 22 temporary licenses. The acupuncture board by rule shall set a time
- 23 limit for the term of a temporary license [(a) The acupuncture
- 24 board may, through the executive director, issue a temporary
- 25 license to practice acupuncture to an applicant who:
- 26 [(1) submits an application on a form prescribed by
- 27 the acupuncture board;

- 1 [(2) has passed a national or other examination
- 2 recognized by the acupuncture board relating to the practice of
- 3 acupuncture;
- 4 [(3) pays the appropriate fee;
- 5 [(4) if licensed in another state, is in good standing
- 6 as an acupuncturist; and
- 7 [(5) meets all the qualifications for a license under
- 8 this chapter but is waiting for the next scheduled meeting of the
- 9 medical board for the license to be issued.
- 10 [(b) A temporary license is valid for 100 days after the
- 11 date issued and may be extended only for another 30 days after the
- 12 date the initial temporary license expires].
- 13 SECTION 9. The heading to Section 205.301, Occupations
- 14 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 205.301. EVALUATION [REFERRAL] BY OTHER HEALTH CARE
- 16 PRACTITIONER REQUIRED.
- 17 SECTION 10. Subsections (a), (b), and (d), Section 205.301,
- 18 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) A license holder may perform acupuncture on a person
- 20 only if the person was [\div
- 21 [(1)] evaluated by a physician, chiropractor, or
- 22 dentist, or a person acting under the delegation and supervision of
- 23 a physician, as appropriate, for the condition being treated within
- 24 12 [six] months before the date acupuncture is performed[; or
- 25 [(2) referred by a chiropractor within 30 days before
- 26 the date acupuncture is performed].
- (b) A license holder acting under Subsection (a) $[\frac{(a)(1)}{(a)}]$

- 1 must obtain reasonable documentation that the required evaluation
- 2 has taken place. If the license holder is unable to determine that
- 3 an evaluation has taken place, the license holder must obtain a
- 4 written statement signed by the person on a form prescribed by the
- 5 acupuncture board that states the person has been evaluated by a
- 6 physician, chiropractor, or dentist, or a person acting under the
- 7 <u>delegation and supervision of a physician,</u> within the prescribed
- 8 time. The form must contain a clear statement that the person
- 9 should be evaluated by a physician, chiropractor, or dentist, or a
- 10 person acting under the delegation and supervision of a physician,
- 11 for the condition being treated by the license holder.
- 12 (d) The medical board, with advice from the acupuncture
- 13 board, by rule may modify:
- 14 (1) the scope of the evaluation under Subsection (a)
- 15 $[\frac{(a)(1)}{(a)}]$; or
- 16 (2) the period during which treatment must begin under
- 17 Subsection (a) $[\frac{(a)(1) \text{ or } (2); \text{ or}}{(a)(a)(a)}]$
- 18 [(3) the number of treatments or days before referral
- 19 to a physician is required under Subsection (c)].
- 20 SECTION 11. Section 205.302, Occupations Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 Sec. 205.302. AUTHORIZED PRACTICE WITHOUT EVALUATION
- 23 [REFERRAL]. [(a) After notice and public hearing, the medical
- 24 board shall determine by rule whether an acupuncturist may treat a
- 25 patient for alcoholism or chronic pain without a referral from a
- 26 physician, dentist, or chiropractor. The medical board shall make
- 27 the determination based on clinical evidence and what the medical

board determines to be in the best interest of affected patients. 1 2 [(b)] Notwithstanding Section 205.301, a license holder may, without an evaluation [a referral] from a physician, dentist, 3 or chiropractor, or a person acting under the delegation and 4 supervision of a physician, perform acupuncture on a person for: 5 (1)smoking addiction; 6 7 (2) weight loss; or [substance abuse,] to the extent permitted by 8 (3) 9 medical board rule adopted with advice from the acupuncture board: (A) substance abuse; 10 11 (B) chronic pain; 12 (C) stress; 13 (D) an allergy; or (E) nausea. 14 SECTION 12. Subsection (a) and (d), Section 205.303, 15 16 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 17 (a) The medical board may certify a person as an acudetox specialist under this section if the person: 18 (1) provides to the medical board documentation that 19 20 the person: (A) is licensed social worker, 21 a licensed 22 professional counselor, licensed psychologist, licensed chemical

dependency counselor, licensed vocational nurse, or licensed

program in acupuncture detoxification that meets guidelines

successfully

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registered nurse; and

approved by the medical board; and

- 1 (2) pays a certification fee in an amount set by the
- 2 <u>acupuncture</u> [medical] board.
- 3 (d) The medical board may annually renew the certification
- 4 of an acudetox specialist under this section if the person:
- 5 (1) provides to the medical board documentation that:
- 6 (A) the certification or license required under
- 7 Subsection (a)(1)(A) is in effect; and
- 8 (B) the person has successfully met continuing
- 9 education requirements established by the medical board under
- 10 Subsection (e); and
- 11 (2) pays a certification renewal fee in an amount set
- 12 by the <u>acupuncture</u> [medical] board.
- 13 SECTION 13. Section 205.3544, Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 205.3544. LIMIT ON ACCESS TO INVESTIGATION FILES.
- 16 (a) Each complaint, adverse report, investigation file, other
- 17 investigation report, and other investigative information in the
- 18 possession of or received or gathered by the acupuncture board or a
- 19 medical board employee or agent relating to a license holder, an
- 20 application for license, or a criminal investigation or proceeding
- 21 is privileged and confidential and is not subject to discovery,
- 22 subpoena, or other means of legal compulsion for release to anyone
- 23 other than the acupuncture board or medical board employees or
- 24 agents involved in discipline of a license holder.
- 25 (b) Investigation records relating to an application for
- 26 license and disciplinary action of a license holder are exempt from
- 27 Chapter 552, Government Code.

- 1 (c) For purposes of this subsection, investigative
- 2 information includes information relating to the identity of, and a
- 3 report made by, a physician performing or supervising compliance
- 4 monitoring for the acupuncture board [The acupuncture board shall
- 5 prohibit or limit access to an investigation file relating to a
- 6 license holder in an informal proceeding in the manner provided by
- 7 Section 164.007(c)].
- 8 SECTION 14. Section 205.355, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 205.355. REQUIRED DISCIPLINARY ACTION FOR FAILURE TO
- 11 OBTAIN EVALUATION [REFERRAL]. A [Except as provided by Section
- 12 $\frac{205.301(a)(2)}{a}$ license to practice acupuncture shall be denied
- 13 or, after notice and hearing, revoked if the applicant or license
- 14 holder violates Section 205.301(a) $[\frac{205.301(a)(1)}{1}]$.
- 15 SECTION 15. Subsection (c), Section 205.301, Occupations
- 16 Code, is repealed.
- 17 SECTION 16. (a) The Texas State Board of Acupuncture
- 18 Examiners shall adopt rules as required by Section 205.101 or
- 19 205.208, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, not later than
- 20 January 1, 2010. A rule or form in effect under Chapter 205,
- 21 Occupations Code, on the effective date of this Act remains in
- 22 effect until January 1, 2010.
- 23 (b) The Texas Medical Board shall adopt necessary rules
- 24 under Section 205.302, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act,
- 25 not later than September 1, 2010.
- 26 (c) An application for a license to practice acupuncture
- 27 filed under Chapter 205, Occupations Code, before January 1, 2010,

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- 1 is covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective
- 2 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 3 purpose.
- 4 SECTION 17. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 5 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 6 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 7 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 8 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
