## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of acupuncture.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 205.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subdivision (2) and adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (2) "Acupuncture" means:
- 8 (A) the [nonsurgical, nonincisive] insertion of
- 9 an acupuncture needle and the application of moxibustion to
- 10 specific areas of the human body as a primary mode of therapy to
- 11 treat and mitigate a human condition, including evaluation and
- 12 assessment of the condition; and
- 13 (B) the administration or recommendation of
- 14 thermal or electrical treatments or [the recommendation] of dietary
- 15 guidelines, energy flow exercise, or dietary or herbal supplements
- 16 in conjunction with the treatment described by Paragraph (A).
- 17 (2-a) "Acupuncture" does not include surgery or
- 18 clinical needle electromyography.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 205.101, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 20 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read
- 21 as follows:
- 22 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d) [Subject to the
- 23 advice and approval of the medical board], the acupuncture board
- 24 shall:

- 1 (1) establish qualifications for an acupuncturist to
- 2 practice in this state;
- 3 (2) establish minimum education and training
- 4 requirements necessary for the acupuncture board to [recommend that
- 5 the medical board] issue a license to practice acupuncture;
- 6 (3) administer an examination that is validated by
- 7 independent testing professionals for a license to practice
- 8 acupuncture;
- 9 (4) develop requirements for licensure by endorsement
- 10 of other states;
- 11 (5) prescribe the application form for a license to
- 12 practice acupuncture;
- 13 (6) [recommend rules to] establish licensing and other
- 14 fees;
- 15 (7) approve educational programs or institutions of
- 16 acupuncture and oriental medicine that meet the acupuncture board's
- 17 minimum standards [establish the requirements for a tutorial
- 18 program for acupuncture students who have completed at least 48
- 19 semester hours of college]; and
- 20 (8) adopt [recommend] additional rules as are
- 21 necessary to administer and enforce this chapter.
- (b) In establishing minimum education and training
- 23 requirements under Subsection (a)(2), the acupuncture board shall
- 24 consider the minimum education and training standards established
- 25 by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental
- 26 Medicine. [The acupuncture board does not have independent
- 27 rulemaking authority. A rule adopted by the acupuncture board is

- 1 subject to medical board approval.
- 2 (d) A rule relating to the scope of practice of acupuncture
- 3 must have the advice and approval of the medical board.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 205.103, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 205.103. FEES. The <u>acupuncture</u> [medical] board shall
- 7 set [and collect] fees in amounts that are reasonable and necessary
- 8 to cover the costs of administering and enforcing this chapter,
- 9 including the costs for [without the use of any other funds
- 10 generated by] the medical board to collect the fees.
- 11 SECTION 4. Section 205.201, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- Sec. 205.201. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) Except as provided by
- 14 Section 205.303, a person may not practice or represent that the
- 15 person practices acupuncture in this state unless the person holds
- 16 a license to practice acupuncture issued by the acupuncture board
- 17 under this chapter.
- 18 (b) A person practices acupuncture if the person performs,
- offers to perform, or attempts to perform acupuncture.
- 20 (c) A person represents that the person practices
- 21 <u>acupuncture if the person:</u>
- (1) uses in connection with the person's name or
- 23 <u>business activity:</u>
- 24 (A) the words "acupuncturist" or "acupuncture";
- 25 (B) the letters or abbreviation "L.Ac." or
- 26 "Lic.Ac."; or
- (C) any other words, letters, abbreviations, or

- 1 insignia indicating or implying that the person is an
- 2 <u>acupuncturist; or</u>
- 3 (2) directly or by implication represents to the
- 4 public that the person is an acupuncturist or that the person
- 5 provides acupuncture.
- 6 (d) This section does not apply to a person acting under the
- 7 <u>delegation and supervision of a physician.</u>
- 8 SECTION 5. Section 205.204, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 205.204. APPLICATION FOR EXAMINATION. An application
- 11 for examination must be:
- 12 (1) in writing on a form prescribed by the acupuncture
- 13 board;
- 14 (2) verified by affidavit;
- 15 (3) filed with the executive director; and
- 16 (4) accompanied by a fee in an amount set by the
- 17 acupuncture [medical] board.
- 18 SECTION 6. Section 205.206, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 19 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 20 (e) The acupuncture board may deny or withdraw the board's
- 21 approval of a school or educational program that does not meet the
- 22 board's prescribed course of study or other educational standards.
- 23 SECTION 7. The heading to Section 205.301, Occupations
- 24 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 205.301. EVALUATION [REFERRAL] BY OTHER HEALTH CARE
- 26 PRACTITIONER REQUIRED.
- 27 SECTION 8. Sections 205.301(a), (b), and (d), Occupations

- 1 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) A license holder may perform acupuncture on a person
- 3 only if the person was[+
- 4 [\(\frac{(1)}{1}\)] evaluated by a physician, chiropractor, or
- 5 dentist, or a person acting under the delegation and supervision of
- 6 <u>a physician</u>, as appropriate, for the condition being treated within
- 7 12 [six] months before the date acupuncture is performed[; or
- 8 [(2) referred by a chiropractor within 30 days before
- 9 the date acupuncture is performed].
- 10 (b) A license holder acting under Subsection (a) (a)
- 11 must obtain reasonable documentation that the required evaluation
- 12 has taken place. If the license holder is unable to determine that
- 13 an evaluation has taken place, the license holder must obtain a
- 14 written statement signed by the person on a form prescribed by the
- 15 acupuncture board that states the person has been evaluated by a
- 16 physician, chiropractor, or dentist, or a person acting under the
- 17 <u>delegation and supervision of a physician,</u> within the prescribed
- 18 time. The form must contain a clear statement that the person  $\ \ \,$
- 19 should be evaluated by a physician, chiropractor, or dentist, or a
- 20 person acting under the delegation and supervision of a physician,
- 21 for the condition being treated by the license holder.
- 22 (d) The medical board, with advice from the acupuncture
- 23 board, by rule may modify:
- 24 (1) the scope of the evaluation under Subsection (a)
- 25  $[\frac{(a)(1)}{(a)}]$ ; or
- 26 (2) the period during which treatment must begin under
- 27 Subsection (a)  $\left[\frac{(a)(1) \text{ or } (2); \text{ or}}{(a)(1) \text{ or } (2); \text{ or}}\right]$

- 1 SECTION 10. Sections 205.303(a) and (d), Occupations Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The medical board may certify a person as an acudetox
- 4 specialist under this section if the person:
- 5 (1) provides to the medical board documentation that
- 6 the person:
- 7 (A) is a licensed social worker, licensed
- 8 professional counselor, licensed psychologist, licensed chemical
- 9 dependency counselor, licensed vocational nurse, or licensed
- 10 registered nurse; and
- 11 (B) has successfully completed a training
- 12 program in acupuncture detoxification that meets guidelines
- 13 approved by the medical board; and
- 14 (2) pays a certification fee in an amount set by the
- 15 <u>acupuncture [medical]</u> board.

- 16 (b) The Texas Medical Board shall adopt necessary rules
- 17 under Section 205.302, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act,
- 18 not later than September 1, 2010.
- 19 (c) An application for a license to practice acupuncture
- 20 filed under Chapter 205, Occupations Code, before the effective
- 21 date of this Act is covered by the law in effect immediately before
- 22 the effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 23 effect for that purpose.
- 24 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 25 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 26 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 27 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
