2	relating to the licensing and regulation of plumbers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 1301.002(4), (5), (7), (8), and (10),
5	Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(4) "Journeyman plumber" means a person licensed under
7	this chapter who:
8	(A) has met the qualifications for registration
9	as a plumber's apprentice or for licensing as a tradesmar
10	plumber-limited license holder;
11	(B) has completed at least 8,000 hours working
12	under the supervision of a master plumber;
13	(C) installs, changes, repairs, services, or
14	renovates plumbing or supervises any of those activities; [and]
15	(D) has passed the required examination; and
16	(E) has fulfilled the other requirements of the
17	board.
18	(5) "Master plumber" means a person licensed under
19	this chapter who:
20	(A) is skilled in the <u>design</u> , planning <u>,</u> and
21	superintending of plumbing and in the practical installation,
22	repair, and servicing of plumbing;
23	(B) has worked as a journeyman plumber:
24	(i) for at least four years; or

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                         (ii) for at least one year and has
   successfully completed a training program approved by the United
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   States Department of Labor, Office of Apprenticeship, or another
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   nationally recognized apprentice training program accepted by the
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   board [secures permits for plumbing work];

   in which a person lives or works or in which persons assemble, ] to:

- 2 (C) a fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or
- 3 piping, including a drain or waste pipe, used to carry wastewater or
- 4 sewage from or within a building to:
- 5 (i) a sewer service lateral at the curb or
- 6 in the street or alley; or
- 7 (ii) a disposal or septic terminal that
- 8 holds private or domestic sewage; or
- 9 (D) the installation, repair, service, or
- 10 maintenance of a fixture, appurtenance, appliance, or piping
- 11 described by Paragraph (A), (B), or (C).
- 12 (8) "Plumbing inspector" means a person who:
- 13 (A) is employed by a political subdivision or
- 14 state agency, or contracts as an independent contractor with a
- 15 political subdivision or state agency, to inspect plumbing in
- 16 connection with health and safety laws, including ordinances, and
- 17 plumbing and gas codes; [and]
- 18 (B) has passed the required examination; and
- 19 (C) has fulfilled the other requirements of the
- 20 board.
- 21 (10) "Tradesman plumber-limited license holder" means
- 22 a person who:
- 23 (A) has completed at least 4,000 hours working
- 24 under the direct supervision of a journeyman or master plumber as a
- 25 plumber's apprentice;
- 26 (B) has passed the required examination [and
- 27 <u>fulfilled the other requirements of the board</u>];

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- 1 (C) constructs and installs plumbing for
- 2 one-family or two-family dwellings; [and]
- 3 (D) has not met or attempted to meet the
- 4 qualifications for a journeyman plumber license; and
- 5 (E) has fulfilled the other requirements of the
- 6 board.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 1301.052, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1301.052. WORK INSIDE COUNTIES OR INSIDE OR OUTSIDE
- 10 MUNICIPALITIES. A person is not required to be licensed under this
- 11 chapter to perform plumbing, other than plumbing performed in
- 12 conjunction with new construction, repair, or remodeling, on a
- 13 property that is:
- 14 (1) located in a subdivision or on a tract of land that
- 15 is not required to be platted under Section 232.0015, Local
- 16 Government Code; [or]
- 17 (2) not connected to a public water system and is
- 18 located outside a municipality; [ex]
- 19 (3) located outside a municipality and connected to a
- 20 public water system that does not require a license to perform
- 21 plumbing; or
- 22 (4) located inside a municipality that is within a
- 23 county that has fewer than 50,000 inhabitants and that:
- 24 (A) has [with] fewer than 5,000 inhabitants; and
- 25 (B) by municipal ordinance or order of the county
- 26 commissioners court has authorized a person who is not licensed
- 27 under this chapter to perform plumbing [, unless an ordinance of the

- 1 municipality requires the person to be licensed].
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 1301.053(a), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) A person is not required to be licensed under this
- 5 chapter to perform:
- 6 (1) plumbing incidental to and in connection with the
- 7 business in which the person is employed or engaged if the person:
- 8 (A) is regularly employed as or acting as a
- 9 maintenance person or maintenance engineer; and
- 10 (B) does not engage in plumbing for the public;
- 11 (2) construction, installation, or maintenance on the
- 12 premises or equipment of a railroad if the person is an employee of
- 13 the railroad who does not engage in plumbing for the public;
- 14 (3) plumbing if the person is engaged by a public
- 15 service company to:
- 16 (A) lay, maintain, or operate its service mains
- 17 or lines to the point of measurement; and
- 18 (B) install, change, adjust, repair, remove, or
- 19 renovate appurtenances, equipment, or appliances;
- 20 (4) appliance installation and service work, other
- 21 than installation and service work on water heaters, that involves
- 22 connecting appliances to existing openings with a code-approved
- 23 appliance connector if the person performs the work as an appliance
- 24 dealer or an employee of an appliance dealer; or
- 25 (5) water treatment installations, exchanges,
- 26 services, or repairs.
- SECTION 4. Section 1301.203(a), Occupations Code, is

- 1 amended to as follows:
- 2 (a) The board may employ a field representative to assist
- 3 the board in enforcing this chapter and rules adopted under this
- 4 chapter. A field representative must [be]:
- 5 (1) hold a license as a plumber under this chapter;
- 6 (2) be knowledgeable of this chapter and municipal
- 7 ordinances relating to plumbing; and
- 8 (3) be $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ qualified by experience and training in
- 9 plumbing practice.
- SECTION 5. Subchapter H, Chapter 1301, Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 1301.405 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1301.405. MANDATORY TRAINING FOR DRAIN CLEANER, DRAIN
- 13 CLEANER-RESTRICTED REGISTRANT, AND RESIDENTIAL UTILITIES
- 14 INSTALLER. (a) To renew the certificate of registration, a person
- 15 who holds a certificate of registration under this chapter as a
- 16 <u>drain cleaner, drain cleaner-restricted registrant, or residential</u>
- 17 utilities installer must annually complete at least six hours of
- 18 approved training that includes training in health and safety
- 19 requirements, board-approved plumbing codes, and water
- 20 conservation.
- 21 (b) A person may receive credit for participating in a
- 22 <u>training program only if the program is provided:</u>
- 23 (1) by a person approved by the board; and
- 24 (2) according to criteria adopted by the board.
- 25 (c) The board by rule may exempt certain persons from the
- 26 requirements of this section if the board determines that the
- 27 exemption is in the public interest.

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- 1 SECTION 6. Section 1301.551, Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 by adding Subsections (e), (f), (g), and (h) to read as follows:
- 3 (e) A municipality or other political subdivision in this
- 4 state that requires a plumbing contractor to obtain a permit before
- 5 the person performs plumbing shall electronically:
- 6 (1) accept permit applications;
- 7 (2) collect required fees; and
- 8 (3) issue the required permits.
- 9 (f) If drawings of proposed plumbing work are required by
- 10 the municipality or other political subdivision, the municipality
- 11 or political subdivision shall specify how permit drawings are to
- 12 be submitted.
- 13 <u>(g)</u> A person who is required to obtain a permit under this
- 14 section is not required to pay a plumbing registration fee or
- 15 <u>administrative fee in a municipality or any other political</u>
- 16 <u>subdivision</u>.
- 17 (h) A plumbing contractor must electronically register with
- 18 a municipality or other political subdivision that requires
- 19 registration before performing plumbing regulated by the
- 20 municipality or other political subdivision.
- 21 SECTION 7. Sections 1301.552 and 1301.553, Occupations
- 22 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 1301.552. CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE FOR PLUMBING PERMIT
- 24 IN POLITICAL SUBDIVISION. A political subdivision that requires a
- 25 plumbing contractor to obtain a permit before performing plumbing
- 26 <u>in the political subdivision shall verify through the board's</u>
- 27 Internet website that the plumbing contractor has on file with the

- 1 board [master plumber to have a bond before issuing a permit to the
- 2 master plumber shall accept either a bond or] a certificate of
- 3 insurance. The certificate of insurance must:
- 4 (1) be written by a company licensed to do business in
- 5 this state;
- 6 (2) provide for commercial general liability
- 7 insurance for the master plumber for a claim for property damage or
- 8 bodily injury, regardless of whether the claim arises from
- 9 negligence or on a contract; and
- 10 (3) provide coverage of not less than \$300,000 for all
- 11 claims arising in a one-year period.
- 12 Sec. 1301.553. PLUMBING INSPECTIONS IN MUNICIPALITY THAT
- 13 OVERLAPS ANOTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISION [MUNICIPAL UTILITY
- 14 DISTRICT]. [(a)] If the boundaries of a municipality and another
- 15 <u>political subdivision</u> [a municipal utility district] overlap, only
- 16 the affected municipality may perform a plumbing inspection and
- 17 collect a permit fee.
- 18 [(b) The standard used in the plumbing inspection may not be
- 19 less restrictive than the standard used by the municipal utility
- 20 district.
- 21 SECTION 8. (a) Not later than January 1, 2010, the Texas
- 22 State Board of Plumbing Examiners shall adopt the rules and approve
- 23 the programs necessary to implement the changes in law made by this
- 24 Act to Chapter 1301, Occupations Code.
- 25 (b) The changes in law made by this Act to the requirements
- 26 for issuance of a license or certificate of registration under
- 27 Chapter 1301, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, apply only

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- 1 to an application submitted for the issuance or renewal of a license
- 2 or certificate of registration under Chapter 1301, Occupations
- 3 Code, on or after January 1, 2010. An application submitted before
- 4 that date is governed by the law in effect when the application was
- 5 submitted, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
