- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 25.083, Education Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 25.083. SCHOOL DAY INTERRUPTIONS. (a) The board of
- 9 trustees of each school district shall adopt and strictly enforce a
- 10 policy limiting interruptions of classes during the school day for
- 11 nonacademic activities such as announcements and sales promotions.
- 12 At a minimum, the policy must limit announcements other than
- 13 emergency announcements to once during the school day.
- 14 (b) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 15 adopt and strictly enforce a policy limiting the removal of
- 16 students from class for remedial tutoring or test preparation. A
- 17 district may not remove a student from a regularly scheduled class
- 18 for remedial tutoring or test preparation if, as a result of the
- 19 removal, the student would miss more than 10 percent of the school
- 20 days on which the class is offered, unless the student's parent or
- 21 another person standing in parental relation to the student
- 22 provides to the district written consent for removal from class for
- 23 such purpose.
- SECTION 2. Subsection (a), Section 25.092, Education Code,

C.S.S.B. No. 1364

- 1 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Except as provided by this section, a student in any
- 3 grade level from kindergarten through grade 12 may not be given
- 4 credit for a class unless the student is in attendance for at least
- 5 90 percent of the days the class is offered.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 29.0821, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 8 (f) Section 25.092 does not apply to a student's attendance
- 9 and nonattendance in a flexible year program under this section.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 11 school year.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
