auxiliary fund at the end of the preceding state fiscal year. If

the amount remaining in the fund exceeds \$5 million, as soon as 11

12 practicable after the date of certification, the attorney general

may transfer from that excess amount in the compensation to victims 13

14 of crime auxiliary fund to the compensation to victims of crime fund

an amount that is not more than 50 percent of the excess amount in 15

the auxiliary fund, to be used only for the purpose of making 16

compensation payments during the fiscal year in which the amount is 17
