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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to establishing the equivalency of competency-based 3 nursing education programs in other states that meet standards of 4 quality equivalent to nursing education programs approved by the 5 Texas Board of Nursing.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 301.157, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (d-4) and adding Subsection (d-4-a) to read as follows:

10 (d-4)The board may recognize and accept as approved under 11 this section a school of nursing or educational program operated in another state and approved by a state board of nursing or other 12 regulatory body of that [another] state. The board shall develop 13 policies to ensure that the other <u>state's</u> [state board's] standards 14 15 are substantially equivalent to the board's standards. For purposes of this subsection, a nursing program shall be deemed to 16 meet standards substantially equivalent to the board's standards if 17 18 it:

19 (1) is part of an institution of higher education 20 located outside this state that is approved by the appropriate 21 regulatory authorities of that state;

22 (2) holds regional accreditation by an accrediting 23 body recognized by the United States secretary of education and the 24 Council for Higher Education Accreditation;

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1	(3) holds specialty accreditation by an accrediting
2	body recognized by the United States secretary of education and the
3	Council for Higher Education Accreditation, including the National
4	League for Nursing Accrediting Commission;
5	(4) requires program applicants to be a licensed
6	practical or vocational nurse, military service corpsman, or
7	paramedic or to hold a degree in a clinically oriented health care
8	field with demonstrated experience providing direct patient care;
9	and
10	(5) graduates students who:
11	(A) achieve faculty-determined program outcomes
12	including passing criterion-referenced examinations of nursing
13	knowledge essential to beginning a registered nurse practice,
14	including a transition to the role of registered nurse;
15	(B) pass a criterion-referenced summative
16	performance examination developed by faculty subject matter
17	experts that measures clinical competencies essential to beginning
18	a registered nurse practice and that meets nationally recognized
19	standards for educational testing, including the educational
20	testing standards of the American Educational Research
21	Association, the American Psychological Association, and the
22	National Council on Measurement in Education; and
23	(C) pass the National Council Licensure
24	Examination for Registered Nurses at a rate equivalent to the pass
25	rate for students of approved in-state programs.
26	(d-4-a) An applicant for licensure under this chapter who
27	has successfully completed a professional nursing education

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1	program in another state meeting the requirements of Subsection
2	(d-4) and who satisfies the other requirements of this chapter is
3	eligible for licensure as a registered nurse.
4	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
5	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
6	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
7	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
8	Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
