Section 301.157, Occupations Code, is amended by 1-14 amending Subsection (d-4) and adding Subsection (d-4-a) to read as 1**-**15 1**-**16 follows: The board may recognize and accept as approved under (d-4) 1-17 this section a school of nursing or educational program operated in 1-18 another state and approved by a state board of nursing or other regulatory body of that [another] state. The board shall develop policies to ensure that the other <u>state's</u> [state board's] standards are substantially equivalent to the board's standards.
