A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to education initiatives for students of limited English
3	proficiency and students at risk of dropping out of school.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 29.067, 29.068, and 29.0681 to read as
7	follows:
8	Sec. 29.067. BILINGUAL BEST PRACTICES GRANT PROGRAM.
9	(a) The commissioner shall establish a grant program to facilitate
10	identification of successful language acquisition programs in this
11	state for students of limited English proficiency and a
12	determination of the best practices used by those programs.
13	(b) The education research centers established under
14	Section 1.005 shall identify successful language acquisition
15	programs operated by school districts in this state based or
16	<pre>consideration of:</pre>
17	(1) the amount of time it takes a student to become
18	proficient in English;
19	(2) the continued academic progress of a student after
20	exiting a program; and
21	(3) any other factor determined to be relevant by the
22	centers.

Subsection (b), the commissioner shall provide grants to pay the

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(c) After successful programs are identified under

- 1 costs of determining the best practices of those programs. The
- 2 education research centers must identify best practices in at least
- 3 the following areas:
- 4 (1) initial teacher training and ongoing professional
- 5 development;
- 6 (2) teaching strategies; and
- 7 (3) collaboration with institutions of higher
- 8 <u>ed</u>ucation.
- 9 <u>(d) The education research centers shall also identify each</u>
- 10 best practice considered likely to be:
- 11 (1) appropriate for implementation in another school
- 12 district, including identification of the type of district in which
- implementation would be appropriate; or
- 14 (2) effective in also addressing the special needs of
- 15 students at risk of dropping out of school, as described by Section
- 16 <u>29.081(d).</u>
- 17 (e) The education research centers shall focus research
- 18 time and effort under this section as follows:
- 19 (1) 75 percent at middle and high schools; and
- 20 (2) 25 percent at elementary schools.
- 21 (f) Programs and strategies identified by the education
- 22 research centers as best practices must be submitted to the best
- 23 practices clearinghouse as provided by Section 7.009.
- 24 (g) Not later than January 1, 2011, the education research
- 25 centers shall prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant
- 26 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 27 presiding officers of the standing committees of each house of the

- 1 legislature with primary jurisdiction over public education a
- 2 report addressing the results of the centers' research under this
- 3 section. This subsection expires September 1, 2011.
- 4 Sec. 29.068. OPTIONAL INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM. (a) A
- 5 district may offer an intensive English program as provided by this
- 6 section for students of limited English proficiency enrolled at or
- 7 above grade level six or promoted to grade level six.
- 8 (b) A student described by Subsection (a) is eligible to
- 9 enroll in the program if the student:
- 10 (1) has not met the requirements for transferring out
- of a bilingual or English as a second language program; and
- 12 (2) has a score or relative degree of achievement on
- 13 the agency-approved English proficiency test that is below the
- 14 <u>level</u> specified by the commissioner for purposes of this
- 15 subdivision.
- 16 (c) A district may not require a student to enroll in a
- 17 program under this section.
- 18 (d) A district that offers a program under this section must
- 19 offer the program to all students eligible under Subsection (b).
- 20 Subject to the availability of local funds or a determination by the
- 21 commissioner that sufficient state funds are available, a district
- 22 may extend eligibility for the program to students who do not
- 23 satisfy the requirements of Subsection (b)(2) but are otherwise
- 24 eligible under Subsection (b).
- (e) Notwithstanding Section 25.081 or 25.082, a program
- 26 under this section may be offered for additional school days beyond
- 27 the district's regular school year or as an extension of a regular

- 1 school day. Section 25.0811 does not apply to a program under this
- 2 section.
- 3 (f) Sections 25.085, 25.086, 25.093, and 25.094 apply to a
- 4 student enrolled in a program under this section and the student's
- 5 parent, as applicable, during the period that the program is
- 6 <u>offered.</u>
- 7 (g) A program under this section must:
- 8 (1) focus on targeted and systematic second language
- 9 acquisition instruction to provide students of limited English
- 10 proficiency with the foundations of the English language for
- 11 purposes of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English;
- 12 (2) report the progress of students enrolled in the
- 13 program in achieving English language proficiency, as required by
- 14 the commissioner;
- 15 (3) be taught by an educator with an English as a
- 16 second language certificate or a bilingual certificate issued under
- 17 Subchapter B, Chapter 21; and
- 18 <u>(4) have a student-to-teacher ratio that does not</u>
- 19 exceed 18 to one.
- 20 (h) A district is entitled to additional funding for
- 21 attendance by eligible students in a program under this section, as
- 22 provided by Section 42.005(h).
- 23 (i) A district may not offer a program under this section as
- 24 <u>a substitute for any other program required to be provided to</u>
- 25 students of limited English proficiency, including a
- 26 prekindergarten program required by Section 29.153.
- 27 (j) This section does not limit the ability of a district to

- 1 provide any additional services to students of limited English
- 2 proficiency.
- 3 (k) In operating a program under this section, a district
- 4 may serve students currently enrolled in a disciplinary alternative
- 5 education program under Chapter 37 in the same classroom as other
- 6 students.
- 7 (1) The commissioner shall adopt rules to implement this
- 8 section, including rules relating to instructional requirements.
- 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the
- 10 commissioner may by rule modify the grade levels at which a program
- 11 is offered or the English language proficiency levels specified for
- 12 purposes of student program eligibility as necessary to limit
- 13 program costs to the amount of available funding.
- 14 (m) The commissioner may establish an application process
- 15 for a district seeking to offer a program under this section.
- 16 (n) The commissioner may require a district to offer a
- 17 program under this section based on an evaluation of the
- 18 effectiveness of the district's existing programs for students of
- 19 limited English proficiency.
- Sec. 29.0681. STUDY. (a) The commissioner shall conduct a
- 21 study of:
- (1) the effectiveness of optional intensive English
- 23 programs under Section 29.068; and
- 24 (2) best practices of public schools in assisting
- 25 students of limited English proficiency enrolled at or above grade
- 26 level six, including recent immigrants.
- 27 (b) Not later than December 1, 2010, the commissioner shall

- 1 prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 2 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officers
- 3 of the standing committees of each house of the legislature with
- 4 primary jurisdiction over public education a report regarding the
- 5 study conducted under this section. The report must include any
- 6 recommendations for changes in programs serving students of limited
- 7 English proficiency enrolled at or above grade level six.
- 8 <u>(c) On the request of the commissioner, an education</u>
- 9 research center established under Section 1.005 shall assist the
- 10 commissioner in conducting the study.
- 11 (d) This section expires September 1, 2011.
- 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Section 29.101 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 29.101. DROPOUT INTERVENTION PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The
- 15 commissioner by rule shall establish a pilot program under which a
- 16 participating school district intervenes with students at risk of
- dropping out of school, as described by Section 29.081(d), by using
- 18 methods focused on improving education attainment by those
- 19 students.
- 20 (b) A school district may apply to the commissioner to
- 21 participate in the pilot program. Subject to receipt of acceptable
- 22 applications, the commissioner shall select school districts for
- 23 participation in the pilot program.
- 24 (c) The pilot program shall focus on students in primary and
- 25 secondary grade levels, with emphasis on:
- 26 (1) students entering middle school; and
- 27 (2) students entering ninth grade.

- 1 (d) A school district participating in the pilot program
- 2 shall implement intervention models that include best practices
- 3 recommended by the Institute of Education Sciences practice guide,
- 4 including models that use dropout monitors and improve academic
- 5 outcomes through reading interventions. Programs and models may be
- 6 based on successful programs and models implemented in other
- 7 states.
- 8 (e) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the
- 9 <u>education research centers established under Section 1.005 shall</u>
- 10 prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 11 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officers
- 12 of the standing committees of each house of the legislature with
- 13 primary jurisdiction over public education a report detailing the
- 14 success of the pilot program starting January 1, 2013.
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 42.005, Education Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Subsection (h) to read as follows:
- (h) Using funds available for that purpose, the
- 18 commissioner shall increase the average daily attendance of a
- 19 district providing an optional intensive English program under
- 20 Section 29.068. An eligible student may accumulate attendance for
- 21 purposes of this section in the same manner as under Section
- 22 29.0822(d), but may not be counted as more than one full-day
- 23 equivalent student on any calendar day. The commissioner shall by
- 24 rule limit additional funding for a student under this subsection
- 25 to no more than 20 days of attendance during a school year or the
- 26 equivalent.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010

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- 1 school year.
- 2 SECTION 5. This Act does not make an appropriation. This
- 3 Act takes effect only if a specific appropriation for the
- 4 implementation of the Act is provided in a general appropriations
- 5 act of the 81st Legislature.
- 6 SECTION 6. Except as provided by Section 5 of this Act, this
- 7 Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of
- 8 all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39,
- 9 Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the
- 10 vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect
- 11 September 1, 2009, except as provided by Section 5 of this Act.
