A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the use of public facilities as emergency shelters
- 3 during disasters.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.004(1), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Disaster" means the occurrence or imminent threat
- 8 of widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property
- 9 resulting from any natural or man-made cause, including fire,
- 10 flood, earthquake, wind, storm, wave action, oil spill or other
- 11 water contamination, volcanic activity, epidemic, air
- 12 contamination, blight, drought, infestation, explosion, riot,
- 13 hostile military or paramilitary action, extreme heat, other public
- 14 calamity requiring emergency action, or energy emergency.
- SECTION 2. Section 418.042(a), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (a) The division shall prepare and keep current a
- 18 comprehensive state emergency management plan. The plan may
- 19 include:
- 20 (1) provisions for prevention and minimization of
- 21 injury and damage caused by disaster;
- 22 (2) provisions for prompt and effective response to
- 23 disaster;
- 24 (3) provisions for emergency relief;

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- 1 (4) provisions for energy emergencies;
- 2 (5) identification of areas particularly vulnerable
- 3 to disasters;
- 4 (6) recommendations for zoning, building
- 5 restrictions, and other land-use controls, safety measures for
- 6 securing mobile homes or other nonpermanent or semipermanent
- 7 structures, and other preventive and preparedness measures
- 8 designed to eliminate or reduce disasters or their impact;
- 9 (7) provisions for assistance to local officials in
- 10 designing local emergency management plans;
- 11 (8) authorization and procedures for the erection or
- 12 other construction of temporary works designed to protect against
- 13 or mitigate danger, damage, or loss from flood, fire, or other
- 14 disaster;
- 15 (9) preparation and distribution to the appropriate
- 16 state and local officials of state catalogs of federal, state, and
- 17 private assistance programs;
- 18 (10) organization of manpower and channels of
- 19 assistance;
- 20 (11) coordination of federal, state, and local
- 21 emergency management activities;
- 22 (12) coordination of the state emergency management
- 23 plan with the emergency management plans of the federal government;
- 24 (13) coordination of federal and state energy
- 25 emergency plans;
- 26 (14) provisions for education and training of local
- 27 officials on activation of the Emergency Alert System established

- 1 under 47 C.F.R. Part 11; [and]
- 2 (15) <u>a list of public facilities that may be used under</u>
- 3 Section 418.017 to shelter individuals during a disaster, including
- 4 air-conditioned facilities for shelter during an extreme heat
- 5 disaster and fortified structures for shelter during a wind
- 6 disaster; and
- 7 (16) other necessary matters relating to disasters.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
