## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 39.112 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 39.112. NOTICE OF EXPIRATION AND PRICE CHANGE. (a) In
- 8 this section, "fixed price contract" means a residential retail
- 9 electric service contract for which the price per kilowatt hour is
- 10 stated in the contract and does not change throughout the term of
- 11 the contract. The term does not include month-to-month service.
- 12 (b) A retail electric provider shall provide a residential
- 13 <u>customer who has a fixed price contract with written notification</u>
- 14 of the date the fixed price contract is scheduled to expire, the
- 15 date the price is scheduled to change, if applicable, and the amount
- 16 of the price change. The notice must:
- 17 (1) be sent to the customer's billing address by mail
- 18 postmarked not less than 60 days before the date the price is
- 19 scheduled to change;

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- 20 (2) be sent to the customer's e-mail address, if
- 21 available to the provider, not less than 60 days before the date the
- 22 price is scheduled to change; and
- 23 (3) include a statement that reads: "You may shop for
- 24 electricity providers at http://www.powertochoose.org."

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- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a contract for retail electric service entered into or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A contract for retail electric service entered into or renewed before the effective date
- 5 of this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before
- 6 the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect
- 7 for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
