4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 659, Government Code, is

6	Sec. 659.025. USE OF COMPENSATORY TIME BY CERTAIN EMERGENCY
7	SERVICES PERSONNEL; OPTIONAL OVERTIME PAYMENT. (a) In this
8	section, "emergency services personnel" includes firefighters,
9	police officers and other peace officers, emergency medical
10	technicians, emergency management personnel, and other individuals
11	who are required, in the course and scope of their employment, to
12	provide services for the benefit of the general public during
13	<pre>emergency situations.</pre>
14	(b) This section applies only to a state employee who is
15	emergency services personnel, who is not subject to the overtime
16	provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29
17	U.S.C. Section 201 et seq.), and who is not an employee of the
18	legislature, including an employee of the lieutenant governor or of
19	a legislative agency.
20	(c) Notwithstanding Section 659.016 or any other law, an
21	employee to whom this section applies may be allowed to take

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(d) Notwithstanding Section 659.016 or any other law, the

compensatory time off during the 18-month period following the end

of the workweek in which the compensatory time was accrued.

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- 1 administrative head of a state agency that employs an employee to
- 2 whom this section applies may pay the employee overtime at the
- 3 employee's regular hourly salary rate for all or part of the hours
- 4 of compensatory time off accrued by the employee during a declared
- 5 <u>disaster in the preceding 18-month period</u>. The administrative head
- 6 shall reduce the employee's compensatory time balance by one hour
- 7 for each hour the employee is paid overtime under this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
