A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the calculation by a school district of a high school
- 3 student's grade point average.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.0252(b), Education Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) If the commissioner develops a standard method under
- 8 this section, a school district shall use the standard method to
- 9 compute a student's high school grade point average[, except that
- 10 to the extent of a conflict between that method and the method
- 11 adopted under Section 51.807, the student's grade point average
- 12 computed in accordance with the method established under Section
- 13 51.807 shall be used in determining the student's eligibility for
- 14 university admission under Subchapter U, Chapter 51].
- SECTION 2. Section 51.807, Education Code, as amended by
- 16 Chapters 941 (H.B. 3826) and 1369 (H.B. 3851), Acts of the 80th
- 17 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is reenacted to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 Sec. 51.807. RULEMAKING. (a) The Texas Higher Education
- 20 Coordinating Board may adopt rules relating to the operation of
- 21 admissions programs under this subchapter, including rules
- 22 relating to the identification of eligible students.
- 23 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, after
- 24 consulting with the Texas Education Agency, by rule shall establish

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- 1 standards for determining for purposes of this subchapter:
- 2 (1) whether a private high school is accredited by a
- 3 generally recognized accrediting organization; and
- 4 (2) whether a person completed a high school
- 5 curriculum that is equivalent in content and rigor to the
- 6 curriculum requirements established under Section 28.025 for the
- 7 recommended or advanced high school program.
- 8 SECTION 3. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 9 over another Act of the 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009,
- 10 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 11 codes.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
