4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.07611 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.07611. DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION PLAN; REPORT. (a) To
8	serve students who require developmental education in an effective
9	and cost-effective manner, the board shall develop a statewide plan
10	for developmental education to be provided under Section 51.3062
11	that:
12	(1) assigns primary responsibility for developmental
13	education to public junior colleges; and
14	(2) provides for using technology, to the greatest
15	extent practicable consistent with best practices, to provide
16	developmental education to students.
17	(b) In developing the developmental education plan, the
18	<pre>board shall:</pre>
19	(1) research issues related to developmental
20	<pre>education;</pre>
21	(2) study and develop best practices for successful
22	developmental education programs, including through use of pilot
23	programs; and

(3) assess various methods of providing developmental

1 education to students to determine which methods, if any, should be 2 implemented on a statewide basis. 3 (c) Developmental education under the plan must include: 4 (1) technological delivery of developmental education 5 courses that allows students to complete course work on any 6 schedule; 7 (2) diagnostic assessments to determine a student's 8 specific educational needs to allow for appropriate developmental instruction; 9 10 (3) modular developmental education course materials; (4) employment of tutors and instructional aides to 11 12 supplement developmental education course instruction as needed for particular students; 13 14 (5) an internal monitoring mechanism to: 15 (A) measure time spent by a student on a particular assignment or on a module of course materials; and 16 17 (B) identify a student's area of academic 18 difficulty; 19 (6) periodic updates of developmental education course materials; and 20 21 (7) assessments after completion of a developmental education course to determine a student's readiness to enroll in 22 23 freshman-level academic courses. 24 (d) The developmental education plan must provide for:

program faculty members, tutors, and instructional aides at the

institutions or other locations where those persons provide

(1) ongoing training for developmental education

1 instruction; and 2 (2) ongoing research and improvement of appropriate developmental education programs, including participation by a 3 group of institution of higher education faculty members selected 4 by the board, to: 5 (A) monitor results of the programs; 6 7 (B) identify successful and unsuccessful program 8 components; and (C) identify possible solutions to program 9 10 problems. (e) Not later than December 1, 2010, the board shall submit 11 12 to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officer of each legislative 13 standing committee with primary jurisdiction over higher education 14 a report concerning the initial development of the developmental 15 education plan under this section, including any recommendations 16 17 for redesign or reassignment among institutions of higher education of existing programs or implementation of new programs and, if 18 19 appropriate, recommendations for legislation. This subsection expires January 1, 2011. 20 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
