## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the issuance of certain permits for overweight
3	vehicles.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 623, Transportation Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapters O and P to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER O. PORT OF CORPUS CHRISTI AUTHORITY ROADWAY PERMITS
8	Sec. 623.280. OPTIONAL PROCEDURE. This subchapter provides
9	an optional procedure for the issuance of a permit by the Port of
10	Corpus Christi Authority for the movement of oversize or overweight
11	vehicles carrying cargo on a roadway owned and maintained by the
12	Port of Corpus Christi Authority that is located in San Patricic
13	County or Nueces County.
14	Sec. 623.281. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "port
15	authority" means the Port of Corpus Christi Authority.
16	Sec. 623.282. ISSUANCE OF PERMITS. The port authority may
17	issue permits for the movement of oversize or overweight vehicles
18	carrying cargo on a roadway owned and maintained by the port
19	authority that is located in San Patricio County or Nueces County.
20	A permit issued under this subchapter is in addition to other
21	permits required by law.
22	Sec. 623.283. PERMIT FEES. (a) The port authority may
23	collect a fee for permits issued under this subchapter. The fees
24	may not exceed \$80 per trip.

1	(b) Fees collected under Subsection (a) shall be used solely
2	for the construction and maintenance of port authority roadways.
3	Sec. 623.284. PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. A permit issued under
4	this subchapter must include:
5	(1) the name of the applicant;
6	(2) the date of issuance;
7	(3) the signature of the manager of transportation of
8	the port authority;
9	(4) a statement of the kind of cargo being
10	transported, the maximum weight and dimensions of the equipment,
11	and the kind and weight of each commodity to be transported;
12	(5) a statement of any condition on which the permit is
13	issued;
14	(6) a statement that the cargo may only be transported
15	on roadways that are owned and maintained by the port authority and
16	located in San Patricio County or Nueces County; and
17	(7) the location where the cargo was loaded.
18	Sec. 623.285. TIME OF MOVEMENT. A permit issued under this
19	subchapter must specify the time in which movement authorized by
20	the permit is allowed.
21	Sec. 623.286. SPEED LIMIT. Movement authorized by a permit
22	issued under this subchapter may not exceed the posted speed limit
23	or 55 miles per hour, whichever is less. Violation of this
24	provision shall constitute a moving violation.
25	Sec. 623.287. ENFORCEMENT. The Department of Public Safety
26	shall have authority to enforce the provisions of this subchapter.
27	Sec. 623.288. RULES. The Texas Transportation Commission

1	may adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter.
2	SUBCHAPTER P. PORT OF CORPUS CHRISTI AUTHORITY SPECIAL FREIGHT
3	CORRIDOR PERMITS
4	Sec. 623.301. OPTIONAL PROCEDURE. This subchapter provides
5	an optional procedure for the issuance of a permit by the Port of
6	Corpus Christi Authority for the movement of oversize or overweight
7	vehicles carrying cargo on a state highway special freight corridor
8	located in San Patricio County.
9	Sec. 623.302. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Port authority" means the Port of Corpus Christi
11	Authority; and
12	(2) "Special freight corridor" means a highway built
13	by this state specifically for the movement of oversize or
14	overweight vehicles carrying cargo in San Patricio County to and
15	from the port authority's La Quinta terminal.
16	Sec. 623.303. ISSUANCE OF PERMITS. The Texas
17	Transportation Commission may authorize the port authority to issue
18	permits for the movement of oversize or overweight vehicles
19	carrying cargo on state highway special freight corridors located
20	in San Patricio County. The port authority may issue a permit under
21	this subchapter only if the cargo being transported weighs 125,000
22	pounds or less.
23	Sec. 623.304. MAINTENANCE CONTRACTS. The port authority
24	shall make payments to the department to provide funds for the
25	maintenance of state highways subject to this subchapter.
26	Sec. 623.305. PERMIT FEES. (a) The port authority may
27	collect a fee for permits issued under this subchapter. The fees

1	may not exceed \$80 per trip.
2	(b) Fees collected under Subsection (a) shall be used solely
3	to provide funds for the payments provided for under Section
4	623.304 and for the port authority's administrative costs, which
5	may not exceed 15 percent of the fees collected. The fees shall be
6	deposited in the state highway fund. Fees deposited in the state
7	highway fund under this section are exempt from the application of
8	Section 403.095, Government Code.
9	Sec. 623.306. PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. (a) A permit issued
10	under this subchapter must include:
11	(1) the name of the applicant;
12	(2) the date of issuance;
13	(3) the signature of the manager of transportation of
14	the port authority;
15	(4) a statement of the kind of cargo being
16	transported, the maximum weight and dimensions of the equipment,
17	and the kind and weight of each commodity to be transported;
18	(5) a statement of any condition on which the permit is
19	issued;
20	(6) a statement that the cargo may only be transported
21	to and from the port authority's La Quinta terminal in San Patricio
22	County using a state highway special freight corridor in San
23	Patricio County; and
24	(7) the location where the cargo was loaded.
25	(b) The port authority shall report to the department all
26	permits issued under this subchapter.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
