A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an algebra instruction grant program.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 29.092 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 29.092. ALGEBRA INSTRUCTION GRANT PROGRAM. (a) From
7	funds appropriated for that purpose, the commissioner shall
8	establish a program under which grants are awarded to school
9	districts to implement an algebra instruction program. From the
10	funds appropriated for use under Section 28.0211, the commissioner
11	may use not more than \$50 million for the grant program provided by
12	this section.
13	(b) The commissioner shall develop a comprehensive
14	intervention plan to assist school districts with a
15	disproportionate number of students who fail to perform
16	satisfactorily on the assessment instrument administered under
17	Section 39.023(a)(1) in grades five through seven. The plan must be
18	based on high-quality research.
19	(c) The commissioner shall establish application criteria
20	for receiving a grant under this section. The criteria must require
21	a school district that applies for a grant to submit a local
22	intervention plan that meets the standards adopted by the
23	commissioner. In awarding grants under this section, the
24	commissioner shall give preference to districts with the lowest

- 1 rate of satisfactory performance on assessment instruments
- 2 administered under Section 39.023(a)(1) in grades five through
- 3 seven.
- 4 (d) A grant under this section must:
- 5 (1) support sustained improvement in the school
- 6 <u>district's pre-algebra mathematics instruction in grades six</u>
- 7 through eight; and
- 8 (2) target students who will be administered the
- 9 Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument beginning in the
- 10 2011-2012 school year.
- 11 (e) A grant awarded under this section may be used for
- 12 providing:
- 13 (1) training and payment of state intervention coaches
- 14 to assist school districts in implementing the grant;
- 15 (2) training and instructional materials in
- 16 pre-algebra skills in grades five through seven;
- 17 (3) professional development of mathematics teachers
- 18 assigned to grades five through seven;
- 19 (4) flexibility in the school day for instruction;
- 20 (5) instructional services; and
- 21 (6) technology as part of instructional activities.
- 22 <u>(f) The commissioner may condition</u> a grant on the
- 23 implementation of the comprehensive intervention plan and may
- 24 withhold or recover any funds not spent as provided by the plan
- 25 approved under Subsection (b). A decision of the commissioner
- 26 under this subsection is final and may not be appealed.
- 27 (g) The commissioner may require a school district to make

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- 1 financial and other commitments as part of a grant application and
- 2 to continue those commitments for not more than two school years
- 3 after the final school year for which the grant applies.
- 4 (h) The commissioner shall:
- 5 (1) establish guidelines for implementing the grant
- 6 program; and
- 7 (2) adopt rules necessary to administer the grant
- 8 program.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
