

AN ACT

relating to the disclosure of criminal history record information to the Court Reporters Certification Board.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subsection (i), Section 411.081, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(i) A criminal justice agency may disclose criminal history record information that is the subject of an order of nondisclosure to the following noncriminal justice agencies or entities only:

- (1) the State Board for Educator Certification;
- (2) a school district, charter school, private school, regional education service center, commercial transportation company, or education shared service arrangement;
- (3) the Texas Medical Board;
- (4) the Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired;
- (5) the Board of Law Examiners;
- (6) the State Bar of Texas;
- (7) a district court regarding a petition for name change under Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Family Code;
- (8) the Texas School for the Deaf;
- (9) the Department of Family and Protective Services;
- (10) the Texas Youth Commission;
- (11) the Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative

Services;

(12) the Department of State Health Services, a local mental health service, a local mental retardation authority, or a community center providing services to persons with mental illness or retardation;

(13) the Texas Private Security Board;

(14) a municipal or volunteer fire department;

(15) the Texas Board of Nursing;

(16) a safe house providing shelter to children in harmful situations;

(17) a public or nonprofit hospital or hospital district;

(18) the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission;

(19) the securities commissioner, the banking commissioner, the savings and mortgage lending commissioner, or the credit union commissioner;

(20) the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy;

(21) the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation;

(22) the Health and Human Services Commission;

(23) the Department of Aging and Disability Services;

(24) the Texas Education Agency; and

(25) the Court Reporters Certification Board.

SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 411.1403 to read as follows:

Sec. 411.1403. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION: COURT REPORTERS CERTIFICATION BOARD. (a) In this

1 section, "board" means the Court Reporters Certification Board
2 established under Chapter 52.

3 (b) The board is entitled to obtain from the department
4 criminal history record information maintained by the department
5 that relates to a person who is an applicant for or the holder of a
6 certification issued by the board.

7 (c) Criminal history record information obtained by the
8 board under Subsection (b):

9 (1) may be used by the board for any purpose related to
10 the issuance, denial, suspension, revocation, or renewal of a
11 certification issued by the board;

12 (2) may not be released or disclosed to any person
13 except on court order or with the consent of the person who is the
14 subject of the information; and

15 (3) shall be destroyed by the board after the
16 information is used for the authorized purposes.

17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
