Subchapter C, Chapter 26, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Section 26.048 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 26.048. CERTAIN MUNICIPALITIES WITH POPULATION OF 7 500,000 OR MORE: ELECTION FROM SINGLE-MEMBER DISTRICTS. (a) The 8 9 governing body of a municipality with a population of 500,000 or more must consist of a mayor elected at large and at least six 10 members elected from single-member districts. A member must reside 11 in the district the member represents. 12 (b) The municipality may provide for the staggering of the 13 14 terms of the members of the municipality's governing body. 15 (c) A single-member district must be compact and consist of contiguous territory. To the extent practicable, all single-member 16 districts must be of equal population. 17 (d) This section does not prevent a municipality from having 18 additional members elected to the governing body from the 19 municipality at-large. 20 21 (e) A municipality must comply with this section beginning with the first general election of members to the municipality's 22 23 governing body that occurs after the year in which the federal decennial census indicates that the municipality meets the 24

1 population requirements of Subsection (a).

SECTION 2. A municipality to which Section 26.048, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, applies on the effective date of this Act must comply with the requirements of that section beginning with the first general election of members to the municipality's governing body that occurs after December 31, 2009.

7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
