8	(a) A defendant may not be convicted of an offense on the testimony
9	of a person to whom the defendant made a statement against the
10	defendant's interest during a time when the person was imprisoned
11	or confined in the same correctional facility as the defendant
12	unless the testimony is corroborated by other evidence tending to
13	connect the defendant with the offense committed. In this
14	subsection, "correctional facility" has the meaning assigned by
15	Section 1.07, Penal Code.
16	(b) Corroboration is not sufficient for the purposes of this
17	article if the corroboration only shows that the offense was
18	committed.
19	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to any
20	case in which a judgment has not been entered before the effective
21	date of this Act. A case in which a judgment has been entered before
22	the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when
23	the judgment was entered, and the former law is continued in effect
24	for that purpose.
