A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the delegation of certain acts of prescriptive
- 3 authority by a physician.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 157.0511(b), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A physician may delegate the carrying out or signing of
- 8 a prescription drug order for a controlled substance only if:
- 9 (1) the prescription is for a controlled substance
- 10 listed in Schedules III, IV, or V as established by the commissioner
- 11 of public health under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code;
- 12 (2) the prescription is for a period not to exceed 90
- 13 [30] days;
- 14 (3) with regard to the refill of a prescription, the
- 15 refill is in accordance with the delegating physician's protocols
- 16 [authorized after consultation with the delegating physician] and
- 17 [the consultation] is noted in the patient's chart; and
- 18 (4) with regard to a prescription for a child less than
- 19 two years of age, the prescription is made after consultation with
- 20 the delegating physician and the consultation is noted in the
- 21 patient's chart.
- SECTION 2. Section 157.053(e), Occupations Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- (e) A physician's authority to delegate the carrying out or

- 1 signing of a prescription drug order is limited to:
- 2 (1) five [three] physician assistants or advanced
- 3 practice nurses or their full-time equivalents practicing at the
- 4 physician's primary practice site or at an alternate practice site
- 5 under Section 157.0541; and
- 6 (2) the patients with whom the physician has
- 7 established or will establish a physician-patient relationship.
- 8 SECTION 3. Sections 157.0541(a), (c), and (e), Occupations
- 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) In this section, "alternate site" means a practice site:
- 11 (1) where services similar to the services provided at
- 12 the delegating physician's primary practice site are provided; and
- 13 (2) located within 90 [60] miles of the delegating
- 14 physician's residence or primary practice site.
- 15 (c) Physician supervision is adequate for the purposes of
- 16 this section if the delegating physician:
- 17 (1) is on-site with the advanced practice nurse or
- 18 physician assistant at least once every 10 business days [20
- 19 percent of the time];
- 20 (2) reviews at least 10 percent of the medical charts,
- 21 which can be reviewed electronically from a remote location, of
- 22 <u>each physician assistant or advanced practice nurse</u> at the site;
- 23 and
- 24 (3) is available through direct telecommunication for
- 25 consultation, patient referral, or assistance with a medical
- 26 emergency.
- (e) The combined number of advanced practice nurses and

- 1 physician assistants to whom a physician may delegate under this
- 2 section and at a primary practice site under Section 157.053 may not
- 3 exceed <u>five</u> [three] physician assistants or advanced practice
- 4 nurses or the full-time equivalent of three physician assistants or
- 5 advanced practice nurses.
- 6 SECTION 4. The Texas Medical Board shall adopt rules under
- 7 Subchapter B, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 8 Act, not later than January 31, 2010.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
