4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 42.0521, Human Resources Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 42.0521. <u>EARLY CHILD CARE DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNT;</u> DEPOSIT
8	OF FEES. (a) The early child care development account is an
9	account in the general revenue fund that may be appropriated only to
10	the department for the purposes and activities authorized by this
11	section and for reasonable administrative expenses under this
12	chapter.
13	(b) The account consists of:
14	<u>(1) the</u> [The] fees authorized by this chapter and
15	received by the department;
16	(2) all money appropriated for the purposes of this
17	section;
18	(3) any gifts, grants, or donations received for the
19	purposes of this section; and
20	(4) interest earned on money in the account.
21	(c) The account is exempt from the application of Section
22	403.095, Government Code.
23	(d) The purpose of the account is to support continuing
24	education initiatives that:

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1 (1) implement infant and toddler child care best 2 practices for caregivers of children from birth to age three; (2) promote the development of secure, consistent, 3 4 responsive relationships and attachments between child care workers and the infants and toddlers in their care; and 5 6 (3) provide training and knowledge on the importance 7 of the emotional development of infants and toddlers [shall be deposited in the general revenue fund]. 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
