1 AN ACT relating to the terms of student members of certain Texas Higher 2 3 Education Coordinating Board advisory committees. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 61.071, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows: 7 8 (b) Not later than August 1 of each odd-numbered year, the board shall provide the following to each institution of higher 9 10 education: (1) a list of available positions 11 for student 12 representatives on board advisory committees, the effective term of each [terms] of those positions, and the duties and requirements 13 for each position; 14 15 (2) a maximum number of nominees determined by the board allowed to be submitted by each institution for each 16 17 position; and (3) an application form for appointment to an advisory 18 19 committee. (b-1) The term of a student representative on a board 20 advisory committee may not be less than two years. 21 22 (c) Not later than September 1 of each odd-numbered year, the president of each institution of higher education shall 23 24 establish a nomination process for the available positions for

1 student representatives on board advisory committees and shall 2 solicit student applications from which the president may select a 3 number of applicants for those positions, not to exceed the maximum 4 number designated by the board for each position.

Not later than the following December 1, the president 5 (d) shall forward the applications of the nominees selected by the 6 7 president to the board for consideration. Not later than the following February 1, the board shall appoint a total of not fewer 8 9 [less] than four student representatives to designated advisory committees of the board, including the Common Application Advisory 10 11 Committee, the Distance Education Advisory Committee, the 12 Financial Aid Advisory Committee, the Undergraduate Education 13 Advisory Committee, the Transfer Issues Advisory Committee, or any other advisory committee created to address the needs of higher 14 education, including committees addressing financial aid, student 15 16 services, and undergraduate education needs.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 61.071, Education Code, apply only to the term of a student member of a Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board advisory committee appointed under that section on or after the effective date of this Act. This Act does not affect the term of a student member of a Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board advisory committee serving on the effective date of this Act.

24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
