A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to emergency management.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 418.005, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (h) to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (a) This section applies only to an elected or appointed
- 8 public officer of the state or of a political subdivision who has
- 9 management or supervisory responsibilities and:
- 10 (1) whose position description, job duties, or
- 11 assignment includes emergency management responsibilities; or
- 12 (2) who plays a role in emergency preparedness,
- 13 response, or recovery.
- 14 (b) Each person described by Subsection (a) shall complete a
- 15 course of training provided or approved by the division of not less
- 16 than three hours regarding the responsibilities of state and local
- 17 governments under this chapter not later than the 180th day after
- 18 the date the person:
- 19 (1) takes the oath of office, if the person is required
- 20 to take an oath of office to assume the person's duties as \underline{a} [an
- 21 appointed] public officer; or
- 22 (2) otherwise assumes responsibilities as a [an
- 23 appointed] public officer, if the person is not required to take an
- 24 oath of office to assume the person's duties.

- 1 (h) The Texas Engineering Extension Service, with the
- 2 direction, oversight, and approval of the division, shall implement
- 3 online courses and secure continuing education credits for elected
- 4 or appointed officials, volunteers, or employees requested to
- 5 attend training or required under Subsection (b) to attend
- 6 training. Training under this subsection is optional for
- 7 volunteers.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 418.013, Government Code, is amended by
- 9 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 (b) The emergency management council is composed of
- 12 <u>representatives</u> [the heads] of state agencies, boards, [and]
- 13 commissions, and [representatives of] organized volunteer groups
- 14 designated by the head of each entity.
- 15 (d) The council shall assist the division in identifying,
- 16 mobilizing, and deploying state resources to respond to major
- 17 <u>emergencies and disasters throughout the state.</u>
- 18 SECTION 3. Subsection (a), Section 418.042, Government
- 19 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The division shall prepare and keep current a
- 21 comprehensive state emergency management plan. The plan may
- 22 include:
- 23 (1) provisions for prevention and minimization of
- 24 injury and damage caused by disaster;
- 25 (2) provisions for prompt and effective response to
- 26 disaster;
- 27 (3) provisions for emergency relief;

- 1 (4) provisions for energy emergencies;
- 2 (5) identification of areas particularly vulnerable
- 3 to disasters;
- 4 (6) recommendations for zoning, building
- 5 restrictions, and other land-use controls, safety measures for
- 6 securing mobile homes or other nonpermanent or semipermanent
- 7 structures, and other preventive and preparedness measures
- 8 designed to eliminate or reduce disasters or their impact;
- 9 (7) provisions for assistance to local officials in
- 10 designing local emergency management plans;
- 11 (8) authorization and procedures for the erection or
- 12 other construction of temporary works designed to protect against
- 13 or mitigate danger, damage, or loss from flood, fire, or other
- 14 disaster;
- 15 (9) preparation and distribution to the appropriate
- 16 state and local officials of state catalogs of federal, state, and
- 17 private assistance programs;
- 18 (10) organization of manpower and channels of
- 19 assistance;
- 20 (11) coordination of federal, state, and local
- 21 emergency management activities;
- 22 (12) coordination of the state emergency management
- 23 plan with the emergency management plans of the federal government;
- 24 (13) coordination of federal and state energy
- 25 emergency plans;
- 26 (14) provisions for providing information to
- 27 [education and training of] local officials on activation of the

- 1 Emergency Alert System established under 47 C.F.R. Part 11; and
- 2 (15) other necessary matters relating to disasters.
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 418.043, Government Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 418.043. OTHER POWERS AND DUTIES. The division shall:
- 6 (1) determine requirements of the state and its
- 7 political subdivisions for food, clothing, and other necessities in
- 8 event of a disaster;
- 9 (2) procure and position supplies, medicines,
- 10 materials, and equipment;
- 11 (3) adopt standards and requirements for local and
- 12 interjurisdictional emergency management plans;
- 13 (4) periodically review local and interjurisdictional
- 14 emergency management plans;
- 15 (5) coordinate deployment of mobile support units;
- 16 (6) establish and operate training programs and
- 17 programs of public information or assist political subdivisions and
- 18 emergency management agencies to establish and operate the
- 19 programs;
- 20 (7) make surveys of public and private industries,
- 21 resources, and facilities in the state that are necessary to carry
- 22 out the purposes of this chapter;
- 23 (8) plan and make arrangements for the availability
- 24 and use of any private facilities, services, and property and
- 25 provide for payment for use under terms and conditions agreed on if
- 26 the facilities are used and payment is necessary;
- 27 (9) establish a register of persons with types of

- 1 training and skills important in disaster mitigation,
- 2 preparedness, response, and recovery;
- 3 (10) establish a register of mobile and construction
- 4 equipment and temporary housing available for use in a disaster;
- 5 (11) assist political subdivisions in developing
- 6 plans for the humane evacuation, transport, and temporary
- 7 sheltering of service animals and household pets in a disaster;
- 8 (12) prepare, for issuance by the governor, executive
- 9 orders and regulations necessary or appropriate in coping with
- 10 disasters;
- 11 (13) cooperate with the federal government and any
- 12 public or private agency or entity in achieving any purpose of this
- 13 chapter and in implementing programs for disaster mitigation,
- 14 preparation, response, and recovery; [and]
- 15 (14) develop a plan to raise public awareness and
- 16 expand the capability of the information and referral network under
- 17 <u>Section 531.0312;</u>
- 18 (15) improve the integration of volunteer groups,
- 19 including faith-based organizations, into emergency management
- 20 plans; and
- 21 (16) do other things necessary, incidental, or
- 22 appropriate for the implementation of this chapter.
- SECTION 5. Section 418.045, Government Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 418.045. TEMPORARY PERSONNEL. (a) The division may
- 26 employ or contract with temporary personnel from funds appropriated
- 27 to the division, from federal funds, or from the disaster

- 1 contingency fund. The merit system does not apply to the temporary
- 2 or contract positions.
- 3 (b) The division may enroll, organize, train, and equip a
- 4 <u>cadre of disaster reservists with specialized skills in disaster</u>
- 5 recovery, hazard mitigation, community outreach, and public
- 6 information to temporarily augment its permanent staff. The
- 7 division may activate enrolled disaster reservists to support
- 8 recovery operations in the aftermath of a disaster or major
- 9 emergency and pay them at a daily rate commensurate with their
- 10 qualifications and experience. Chapter 654, Chapter 2254, and
- 11 Subtitle D, Title 10, do not apply in relation to a disaster
- 12 reservist under this subsection.
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 418.048, Government Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 418.048. MONITORING WEATHER[; SUSPENSION OF WEATHER
- 16 MODIFICATION]. [(a)] The division shall keep continuously
- 17 apprised of weather conditions that present danger of climatic
- 18 activity, such as precipitation, severe enough to constitute a
- 19 disaster.
- 20 [(b) If the division determines that precipitation that may
- 21 result from weather modification operations, either by itself or in
- 22 conjunction with other precipitation or climatic conditions or
- 23 activity, would create or contribute to the severity of a disaster,
- 24 it shall request in the name of the governor that the officer or
- 25 agency empowered to issue permits for weather modification
- 26 operations suspend the issuance of permits. On the governor's
- 27 request, no permits may be issued until the division informs the

1 officer or agency that the danger has passed.

- 2 SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 418.075 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 418.075. REQUEST FOR FUNDS; HOSPITALS. A hospital may
- 5 request funding from the disaster contingency fund or through a
- 6 mutual aid agreement with a political subdivision for deployment of
- 7 hospital services, treatment of evacuees, and nonlocal emergency
- 8 medical services in the event of a disaster.
- 9 SECTION 8. Subsection (b), Section 418.107, Government
- 10 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) Political subdivisions may make agreements for the
- 12 purpose of organizing emergency management service divisions and
- 13 provide for a mutual method of financing the organization of units
- 14 on a basis satisfactory to the subdivisions. [The functioning of
- 15 the units shall be coordinated by the emergency management
- 16 council.
- 17 SECTION 9. Section 418.117, Government Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 418.117. LICENSE PORTABILITY. If the assistance of a
- 20 person who holds a license, certificate, permit, or other document
- 21 evidencing qualification in a professional, mechanical, or other
- 22 skill is requested by a $\underline{\text{state agency or}}$ local government entity
- 23 under the system, the person is considered licensed, certified,
- 24 permitted, or otherwise documented in the political subdivision in
- 25 which the service is provided as long as the service is required,
- 26 subject to any limitations imposed by the chief executive officer
- 27 or the governing body of the requesting state agency or local

- 1 government entity.
- 2 SECTION 10. Subsection (b), Section 418.172, Government
- 3 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (b) If sufficient funds are not available for the required
- 5 insurance, an agency may request funding from [petition] the
- 6 disaster contingency fund [emergency funding board] to purchase the
- 7 insurance [on the agency's behalf. The board may spend money from
- 8 that fund for that purpose].
- 9 SECTION 11. Subchapter H, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Sections 418.188, 418.1881, and 418.1882 to read
- 11 as follows:
- 12 Sec. 418.188. POSTDISASTER EVALUATION. Not later than the
- 13 30th day after the date a request is received from the division, a
- 14 state agency, political subdivision, or interjurisdictional agency
- 15 shall conduct an evaluation of the entity's response to a disaster,
- 16 identify areas for improvement, and issue a report of the
- 17 <u>evaluation to the division.</u>
- Sec. 418.1881. SHELTER OPERATIONS. The Department of State
- 19 Health Services shall develop, with the direction, oversight, and
- 20 approval of the division, an annex to the state emergency
- 21 management plan that includes provisions for:
- 22 (1) developing medical special needs categories;
- 23 (2) categorizing the requirements of individuals with
- 24 medical special needs; and
- 25 (3) establishing minimum health-related standards for
- 26 short-term and long-term shelter operations for shelters operated
- 27 with state funds or receiving state assistance.

- 1 Sec. 418.1882. PERSONNEL SURGE CAPACITY PLANNING. With the
- 2 direction, oversight, and approval of the division and the
- 3 assistance of the Department of State Health Services, health care
- 4 facilities, county officials, and other appropriate entities, each
- 5 council of government, regional planning commission, or similar
- 6 regional planning agency created under Chapter 391, Local
- 7 Government Code, shall develop a regional plan for personnel surge
- 8 capacity during disasters, including plans for providing lodging
- 9 and meals for disaster relief workers and volunteers.
- 10 SECTION 12. Section 418.072, Government Code, is repealed.
- 11 SECTION 13. On the effective date of this Act, the disaster
- 12 emergency funding board is abolished.
- 13 SECTION 14. The changes in law made by this Act by the
- 14 amendment of Section 418.005, Government Code, apply only to a
- 15 public officer elected or appointed on or after the effective date
- 16 of this Act. A public officer elected or appointed before the
- 17 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 18 immediately before that date, and the former law is continued in
- 19 effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
