1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the dissemination of information regarding the cost of
- 3 attending public and private institutions of higher education and
- 4 regarding the availability of financial aid to assist in paying
- 5 that cost.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 61.0777 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 61.0777. UNIFORM STANDARDS FOR PUBLICATION OF COST OF
- 10 ATTENDANCE INFORMATION. (a) The board shall prescribe uniform
- 11 standards intended to ensure that information regarding the cost of
- 12 attendance at institutions of higher education is available to the
- 13 public in a manner that is consumer-friendly and readily
- 14 understandable to prospective students and their families. In
- 15 developing the standards, the board shall examine common and
- 16 recommended practices regarding the publication of such
- 17 information and shall solicit recommendations and comments from
- 18 <u>institutions of higher education and interested private or</u>
- 19 <u>independent institutions of higher education.</u>
- 20 <u>(b) The uniform standards must:</u>
- 21 (1) address all of the elements that constitute the
- 22 total cost of attendance, including tuition and fees, room and
- 23 board costs, book and supply costs, transportation costs, and other
- 24 personal expenses; and

- 1 (2) prescribe model language to be used to describe
- 2 <u>each element of the cost of attendance.</u>
- 3 (c) Each institution of higher education that offers an
- 4 <u>undergraduate degree or certificate program shall:</u>
- 5 (1) prominently display on the institution's Internet
- 6 website in accordance with the uniform standards prescribed under
- 7 this section information regarding the cost of attendance at the
- 8 <u>institution by a full-time entering first-year student; and</u>
- 9 (2) conform to the uniform standards in any electronic
- 10 or printed materials intended to provide to prospective
- 11 undergraduate students information regarding the cost of
- 12 <u>attendance at the institut</u>ion.
- 13 (d) Each institution of higher education shall consider the
- 14 uniform standards prescribed under this section when providing
- 15 information to the public or to prospective students regarding the
- 16 cost of attendance at the institution by nonresident students,
- 17 graduate students, or students enrolled in professional programs.
- 18 <u>(e) The board shall prescribe requirements for an</u>
- 19 institution of higher education to provide on the institution's
- 20 Internet website consumer-friendly and readily understandable
- 21 information regarding student financial aid opportunities. The
- 22 required information must be provided in connection with the
- 23 information displayed under Subsection (c)(1) and must include a
- 24 link to the primary federal student financial aid Internet website
- 25 intended to assist persons applying for student financial aid.
- 26 (f) The board shall provide on the board's Internet website
- 27 a program or similar tool that will compute for a person accessing

- 1 the website the estimated net cost of attendance for a full-time
- 2 entering first-year student attending an institution of higher
- 3 education. The board shall require each institution to provide the
- 4 board with the information the board requires to administer this
- 5 subsection.
- 6 (g) The board shall prescribe the initial standards and
- 7 requirements under this section not later than January 1, 2010.
- 8 <u>Institutions of higher education shall comply with the standards</u>
- 9 and requirements not later than April 1, 2010. This subsection
- 10 expires January 1, 2011.
- 11 (h) The board shall encourage private or independent
- 12 institutions of higher education approved under Subchapter F to
- 13 participate in the tuition equalization grant program, to the
- 14 greatest extent practicable, to prominently display the
- 15 <u>information described by Subsections (a) and (b) on their Internet</u>
- 16 websites in accordance with the standards established under those
- 17 <u>subsections</u>, and to conform to those standards in electronic and
- 18 printed materials intended to provide to prospective undergraduate
- 19 students information regarding the cost of attendance at the
- 20 institutions. The board shall also encourage those institutions to
- 21 include on their Internet websites a link to the primary federal
- 22 student financial aid Internet website intended to assist persons
- 23 applying for student financial aid.
- 24 (i) The board shall make the program or tool described by
- 25 Subsection (f) available to private or independent institutions of
- 26 <u>higher education described by Subsection (h), and those</u>
- 27 institutions shall make that program or tool, or another program or

- 1 tool that complies with the requirements for the net price
- 2 calculator required under Section 132(h)(3), Higher Education Act
- 3 of 1965 (20 U.S.C. Section 1015a), available on their Internet
- 4 websites not later than the date by which the institutions are
- 5 required by Section 132(h)(3) to make the net price calculator
- 6 publicly available on their Internet websites.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
