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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the Texas Rangers' unsolved crimes investigation team.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter J, Chapter 411,
- 5 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 SUBCHAPTER J. UNSOLVED CRIMES INVESTIGATION PROGRAM [TEAM]
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 411.262, Government Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 411.262. UNSOLVED CRIMES INVESTIGATION PROGRAM
- 10 [TEAM]. (a) The unsolved crimes investigation program [team] is
- 11 an investigative program [investigatory unit] within the
- 12 department.
- 13 (b) The program is a function [team will be located at the
- 14 headquarters] of the Texas Rangers [in Austin, Texas,] and will be
- 15 commanded by the chief of the Texas Rangers.
- 16 (c) The director may employ commissioned peace officers and
- 17 noncommissioned employees to perform duties required of the program
- 18 [team].
- 19 (d) To be eligible for employment under this section, a
- 20 peace officer must be a sergeant or higher-ranked officer of the
- 21 Texas Rangers and must have [not less than four years of experience
- 22 as a peace officer and:
- [(1) a degree from an accredited institution of higher
- 24 education in law, accounting, or computer science; or

- 1 $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ two or more years of experience in the
- 2 investigation of homicides or other major felonies.
- 3 (e) To be eligible for employment under this section, a
- 4 noncommissioned employee must meet the experience, training, and
- 5 educational qualifications set by the director as requirements for
- 6 investigating or assisting in the investigation of an unsolved
- 7 crime.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 411.263, Government Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 411.263. ASSISTANCE ON REQUEST. On the request of an
- 11 attorney representing the state and with the approval of the
- 12 director, employees of the unsolved crimes investigation program
- 13 [team] of the department may assist local law enforcement in the
- 14 investigation of crime.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
