## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the requirement of citizenship or lawful presence in
- 3 the United States for issuance of a driver's license, personal
- 4 identification certificate, commercial driver's license, or
- 5 commercial driver learner's permit.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 521.041(b), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (b) The department shall maintain suitable indexes, in
- 10 alphabetical or numerical order, that contain:
- 11 (1) each denied application and the reasons for the
- 12 denial;
- 13 (2) each application that is granted; [and]
- 14 (3) the name of each license holder whose license has
- 15 been suspended, canceled, or revoked and the reasons for that
- 16 action; and
- 17 (4) the citizenship status of each holder of a license
- 18 or personal identification certificate.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 521.101, Transportation Code, is amended
- 20 by amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsections (d-1), (f-1),
- 21 (f-2), (f-3), and (f-4) to read as follows:
- 22 (d-1) Unless the information has been previously provided
- 23 to the department, the department shall require each applicant for
- 24 an original, renewal, or duplicate personal identification

- 1 <u>certificate to furnish to the department:</u>
- 2 (1) proof of the applicant's United States
- 3 citizenship; or
- 4 (2) documentation described by Subsection (f-1).
- 5 (f) A certificate issued to an applicant who is a citizen of
- 6 the United States expires on a date specified by the department,
- 7 except that a certificate issued to a person 60 years of age or
- 8 older does not expire.
- 9 (f-1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States must
- 10 present to the department documentation issued by the United States
- 11 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration that authorizes
- 12 the applicant to be in the United States.
- 13 (f-2) The department may not issue an identification
- 14 certificate to an applicant:
- 15 (1) who fails or refuses to comply with Subsection
- 16 (f-1); or
- 17 (2) whose lawful admission period in the United States
- 18 expires before the 180th day after the application date.
- 19 (f-3) An identification certificate issued to an applicant
- 20 who is not a citizen of the United States expires on the earlier of:
- 21 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission
- 22 period in the United States expires; or
- 23 (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance.
- 24 (f-4) In addition to a certificate issued under this
- 25 section, Subsections (f-1), (f-2), and (f-3) apply to a personal
- 26 identification certificate for which application is made under
- 27 Section 521.103.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 521.121(a), Transportation Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The driver's license must include:
- 4 (1) a distinguishing number assigned by the department
- 5 to the license holder;
- 6 (2) a color photograph of the entire face of the
- 7 holder;
- 8 (3) the full name, date of birth, and residence
- 9 address of the holder; [and]
- 10 (4) a brief description of the holder; and
- 11 (5) a statement as to whether the holder is a citizen
- 12 of the United States.
- SECTION 4. Section 521.142, Transportation Code, is amended
- 14 by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsections (e-1) and (e-2)
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 (e) The application must include any other information the
- 17 department requires to determine the applicant's identity,
- 18 residency, competency, and eligibility.
- 19 (e-1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States must
- 20 present to the department documentation issued by the United States
- 21 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration that authorizes
- 22 the applicant to be in the United States.
- 23 <u>(e-2) The department may not issue a license to an</u>
- 24 applicant:
- 25 (1) who fails or refuses to comply with Subsection
- 26 (e-1); or
- 27 (2) whose lawful admission period in the United States

- 1 expires before the 180th day after the date of the application.
- 2 SECTION 5. Section 521.1425, Transportation Code, is
- 3 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (a) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [<del>Subsection</del>] (b) <u>and</u>
- 6 (c), the department may require each applicant for an original,
- 7 renewal, or duplicate driver's license to furnish to the department
- 8 the information required by Section 521.142.
- 9 (c) Unless the information has been previously provided to
- 10 the department, the department shall require each applicant for an
- 11 original, renewal, or duplicate driver's license to furnish to the
- 12 department:
- 13 (1) proof of the applicant's United States
- 14 citizenship; or
- 15 (2) documentation described by Section 521.142(e-1).
- SECTION 6. Section 521.271, Transportation Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 521.271. LICENSE EXPIRATION. (a) Each original
- 19 driver's license, [and] provisional license, or occupational
- 20 license issued to an applicant who is a citizen of the United States
- 21 expires as follows:
- 22 (1) except as provided by Section 521.2711, a driver's
- 23 license expires on the first birthday of the license holder
- 24 occurring after the sixth anniversary of the date of the
- 25 application;
- 26 (2) a provisional license expires on the earlier of:
- 27 (A) the 18th birthday of the license holder; or

- 1 (B) the first birthday of the license holder
- 2 occurring after the date of the application;
- 3 (3) an instruction permit expires on the second
- 4 birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of the
- 5 application; and
- 6 (4) an occupational license expires on the first
- 7 anniversary of the court order granting the license.
- 8 (b) Except as provided by <u>Subsection (c) and Section</u>
- 9 521.2711, a driver's license that is renewed expires on the sixth
- 10 anniversary of the expiration date before renewal.
- 11 (c) A driver's license, provisional license, or
- 12 <u>occupational license issued to an applicant who is not a citizen of</u>
- 13 the United States expires on the earlier of:
- 14 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission
- 15 period in the United States expires; or
- 16 (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance.
- 17 SECTION 7. Section 521.2711, Transportation Code, is
- 18 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 19 (c) Notwithstanding Subsections (a) and (b), an original or
- 20 renewal driver's license issued to an applicant who is 85 years of
- 21 age or older and not a citizen of the United States expires on the
- 22 earlier of:
- 23 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission
- 24 period in the United States expires; or
- 25 (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance.
- SECTION 8. Section 521.272, Transportation Code, is amended
- 27 by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (c) Notwithstanding Section 521.271, a driver's license
- 3 issued under this section to an applicant who is a citizen of the
- 4 United States, including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected
- 5 license, expires on the first birthday of the license holder
- 6 occurring after the date of application, except that the initial
- 7 license issued under this section expires on the second birthday of
- 8 the license holder occurring after the date of application. This
- 9 subsection does not apply to:
- 10 (1) a provisional license;
- 11 (2) an instruction permit issued under Section
- 12 521.222; or
- 13 (3) a hardship license issued under Section 521.223.
- 14 (d) A driver's license issued under this section to an
- 15 applicant who is not a citizen of the United States expires on the
- 16 <u>earlier of:</u>
- 17 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission
- 18 period in the United States expires; or
- 19 <u>(2) the first annivers</u>ary of the date of issuance.
- SECTION 9. Subchapter R, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
- 21 is amended by adding Section 521.428 to read as follows:
- 22 <u>Sec. 521.428. FEES FOR LICENSE OR PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION</u>
- 23 <u>CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO PERSON NOT CITIZEN OF UNITED STATES.</u> (a)
- 24 Notwithstanding Sections 521.421 and 521.422, the department by
- 25 rule shall establish the amount of the fee for issuance of a license
- 26 or personal identification certificate issued to an applicant who
- 27 is not a citizen of the United States.

- 1 (b) The amount of the fee may not exceed the amount of the
- 2 fee otherwise imposed by this subchapter or the amount that is
- 3 sufficient, when added to other fees collected under this chapter,
- 4 to recover the actual costs to the department of issuing the license
- 5 or certificate.
- 6 SECTION 10. Section 522.021(c), Transportation Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The application must meet the requirements of an
- 9 application under Sections [Section] 521.141, 521.142, and
- 10 <u>521.1425</u> and [must] be accompanied by the fee required under
- 11 Section 522.029. The department may require documentary evidence
- 12 to verify the information required by this section [Subsection
- 13  $\frac{(a)}{(a)}$ ].
- 14 SECTION 11. Section 522.029, Transportation Code, is
- 15 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (1) to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (a) The fee for a commercial driver's license or commercial
- 18 driver learner's permit issued by the department is \$60, except as
- 19 provided by Subsections (f), (h), [and] (j), and (l).
- 20 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
- 21 the department by rule shall establish the amount of the fee for
- 22 <u>issuance of a commercial driver's license or commercial driver</u>
- 23 learner's permit issued to an applicant who is not a citizen of the
- 24 United States. The amount of the fee may not exceed the amount of
- 25 the fee otherwise imposed by this subchapter or the amount that is
- 26 sufficient, when added to other fees collected under this chapter,
- 27 to recover the actual costs to the department of issuing the license

- 23 <u>citizenship; or</u>
- 24 (2) documentation described by Section 521.142(e-1).
- 25 SECTION 15. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
- 26 to a driver's license, personal identification certificate,
- 27 commercial driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit

- 1 issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 2 driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial
- 3 driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit issued or
- 4 renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 5 in effect when the license, certificate, or permit was issued, and
- 6 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
