- Sec. 61.8221. COURSE TRANSFER STUDY. (a) The board shall 1 2 establish and direct a committee of representatives from public and private two-year and four-year institutions of higher education to 3 study and make recommendations regarding the transferability of 4 courses in the core curriculum from for-profit career schools to 5 6 public and private institutions of higher education. Not later than January 1, 2011, the board shall report the recommendations to 7 the chair of each standing committee of the legislature with 8 9 primary jurisdiction over higher education.
- 10 (b) This section expires September 1, 2011.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
