## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to orientation programs for new students at public
3	institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 51.978 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.978. ORIENTATION PROGRAM. (a) In this section,
8	"institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by
9	Section 61.003.
10	(b) An institution of higher education shall provide an
11	orientation program for each student, including a student
12	transferring to the institution, before or during the first
13	semester or other academic term in which the student is enrolled at
14	the institution.
15	(c) Each institution of higher education may determine the
16	format and length of and attendance requirements for the
17	orientation program that the institution provides under this
18	section, except that the program must include advising regarding:
19	(1) the degree and professional programs offered by
20	the institution;
21	(2) the student's postgraduation goals, including
22	career planning and graduate school; and
23	(3) transferring to a four-year institution, if the
24	institution offers only lower-division courses.

1 (d) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 2 provide online resources to assist an institution of higher 3 education in the development and implementation of an orientation 4 program. The resources must focus on programs that have proven 5 successful in improving the retention of students at institutions 6 of higher education.

SECTION 2. Section 51.978, Education Code, as added by this Act, applies beginning with students admitted to an institution of higher education for the 2010 fall semester.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
