8 SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this 9 section, this Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of 10 two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by 11 Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not 12 receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes 13 effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative 14 session.

(b) The change in law made by this Act to Section81.0445(d), Health and Safety Code, takes effect September 1, 2009.
