A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a home- and community-based
3	services workforce council.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter P-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER P-1. HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES WORKFORCE
8	COUNCIL
9	Sec. 531.621. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "council"
10	means the home- and community-based services workforce council.
11	Sec. 531.622. HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES WORKFORCE
12	COUNCIL; COMPOSITION. (a) The home- and community-based services
13	workforce council is established.
14	(b) The council is composed of 13 members appointed by the
15	<pre>executive commissioner as follows:</pre>
16	(1) two members who are, at the time of appointment,
17	recipients of home- and community-based services;
18	(2) one family member of a child who is, at the time of
19	appointment, receiving home- and community-based services;
20	(3) three members who, at the time of appointment,
21	provide attendant services to recipients of home- and
22	<pre>community-based services;</pre>
23	(4) one member who is a representative of the
24	Disability Policy Consortium;

- 1 (5) one member who is a representative of the American
- 2 Association of Retired Persons;
- 3 (6) one member who is a representative of the Texas
- 4 Association of Area Agencies on Aging;
- 5 (7) one member who is a representative of the Texas
- 6 Association of Centers for Independent Living;
- 7 (8) one member who is a representative of a local
- 8 mental retardation authority;
- 9 <u>(9) one member who is a representative of the Texas</u>
- 10 Association for Home Care, Incorporated; and
- 11 (10) one member who is a representative of the Private
- 12 Providers Association of Texas.
- 13 (c) A member of the council serves at the pleasure of the
- 14 executive commissioner.
- 15 (d) The executive commissioner shall select a presiding
- 16 officer from among the members of the council.
- Sec. 531.623. COMPENSATION. A council member serves
- 18 without compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for actual
- 19 and necessary expenses incurred in performing functions as a
- 20 council member, subject to any applicable limitation on
- 21 reimbursement provided by the General Appropriations Act.
- Sec. 531.624. COUNCIL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The
- 23 council shall:
- (1) at least quarterly, meet at the call of the
- 25 presiding officer;
- 26 (2) identify and study workforce issues relating to
- 27 the provision of home- and community-based services to the aging

- 1 and disabled populations of this state, including issues relating
- 2 to wages and benefits, turnover, recruitment, and retention of
- 3 personal attendants;
- 4 (3) review the current and anticipated need in this
- 5 state for home- and community-based services and the workforce
- 6 available in this state to meet that need;
- 7 (4) solicit, review, and make policy and funding
- 8 recommendations relating to home- and community-based services;
- 9 (5) request reports and other information relating to
- 10 the home- and community-based services workforce as necessary from
- 11 the executive commissioner, the Department of Aging and Disability
- 12 Services, other health and human services agencies, the Texas
- 13 Workforce Commission, or the attorney general; and
- 14 (6) make recommendations to the executive
- 15 commissioner and the legislature regarding the issues specified in
- 16 <u>Subdivision (2).</u>
- 17 <u>(b) The commission shall provide assistance and resources</u>
- 18 to the council as necessary for the council to perform its duties
- 19 under this subchapter.
- Sec. 531.625. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 1 of
- 21 <u>each even-numbered year, the council shall submit a report</u> based on
- 22 <u>its findings to:</u>
- 23 <u>(1) the executive commissioner;</u>
- 24 (2) the governor;
- 25 (3) the lieutenant governor;
- 26 (4) the speaker of the house of representatives;
- 27 (5) the senate finance committee;

	(6) the house appropriations committee,
2	(7) the senate health and human services committee;
3	<u>and</u>
4	(8) the house human services committee.
5	(b) The report must include:
6	(1) an analysis of the current and anticipated funding
7	needs for home- and community-based services in this state and the
8	workforce available to meet that need;
9	(2) identification of significant problems in the
10	home- and community-based services workforce; and
11	(3) policy and funding recommendations.
12	SECTION 2. Not later than the 30th day after the effective
13	date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
14	Services Commission shall appoint the members of the home- and
15	community-based services workforce council as established by
16	Subchapter P-1, Chapter 531, Government Code, as added by this Act.
17	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
18	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
19	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
20	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
21	Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
