(1) an analysis of the current and anticipated funding needs for home- and community-based services in this state and the workforce available to meet that need;

(2) identification of significant problems home- and community-based services workforce; and

(3) policy and funding recommendations.

SECTION 2. Not later than the 30th day after the effective date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall appoint the members of the home- and community-based services workforce council as established by Subchapter P-1, Chapter 531, Government Code, as added by this Act. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
