A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation and operation of a council to increase
3	state efforts to offer service-enriched housing through increased
4	coordination of housing and health services.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 2306, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter NN to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER NN. HOUSING AND HEALTH SERVICES COORDINATION COUNCIL
9	Sec. 2306.1091. DEFINITIONS. (a) In this subchapter,
10	"council" means the housing and health services coordination
11	council.
12	(b) With the advice and assistance of the council, the
13	department by rule shall define "service-enriched housing" for the
14	purposes of this subchapter.
15	Sec. 2306.1092. COMPOSITION. (a) The department shall
16	establish a housing and health services coordination council.
17	(b) The council is composed of 16 members consisting of:
18	(1) the director;
19	(2) one representative from each of the following
20	agencies, appointed by the head of that agency:
21	(A) the Office of Rural Community Affairs;
22	(B) the Texas State Affordable Housing
23	<pre>Corporation;</pre>
24	(C) the Health and Human Services Commission;

- 9 <u>(d) The director serves as the presiding officer of the</u>
- 10 council.
- 11 Sec. 2306.1093. TERMS. (a) A member of the council who
- 12 represents a state agency serves at the pleasure of the head of that
- 13 agency.
- 14 (b) Members of the council who are appointed by the governor
- 15 serve staggered six-year terms, with the terms of two or three
- 16 members expiring on September 1 of each odd-numbered year.
- 17 Sec. 2306.1094. OPERATION OF COUNCIL. (a) The council
- 18 shall meet at least quarterly.
- (b) The department shall provide clerical and advisory
- 20 support staff to the council.
- 21 (c) Except as provided by Section 2306.1095, Chapter 2110
- 22 does not apply to the size, composition, or duration of the council.
- Sec. 2306.1095. <u>COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT</u>. (a) A
- 24 member of the council who is appointed by the governor may not
- 25 receive compensation for service on the council. The member may
- 26 receive reimbursement from the department for actual and necessary
- 27 expenses incurred in performing council functions as provided by

2	(b) A member of the council who is not appointed by the
3	governor may not receive compensation for service on the council or
4	reimbursement for expenses incurred in performing council
5	functions.
6	Sec. 2306.1096. DUTIES; BIENNIAL REPORT. (a) The council
7	shall:
8	(1) develop and implement policies to coordinate and
9	increase state efforts to offer service-enriched housing;
10	(2) identify barriers preventing or slowing
11	service-enriched housing efforts, including barriers attributable
12	to the following factors:
13	(A) regulatory requirements and limitations;
14	(B) administrative limitations;
15	(C) limitations on funding; and
16	(D) ineffective or limited coordination;
17	(3) develop a system to cross-educate selected staff
18	in state housing and health services agencies to increase the
19	number of staff with expertise in both areas and to coordinate
20	relevant staff activities of those agencies;
21	(4) identify opportunities for state housing and
22	health services agencies to provide technical assistance and
23	training to local housing and health services entities about:
24	(A) the cross-education of staff;
25	(B) coordination among those entities; and
26	(C) opportunities to increase local efforts to
27	create service-enriched housing; and

1	(5) develop suggested performance measures to track
2	progress in:
3	(A) the reduction or elimination of barriers in
4	<pre>creating service-enriched housing;</pre>
5	(B) increasing the coordination between state
6	housing and health services agencies;
7	(C) increasing the number of state housing and
8	health services staff who are cross-educated or who have expertise
9	in both housing and health services programs; and
10	(D) the provision of technical assistance to
11	local communities by state housing and health services staff to
12	increase the number of service-enriched housing projects.
13	(b) The council shall develop a biennial plan to implement
14	the goals described by Subsection (a).
15	(c) Not later than August 1 of each even-numbered year, the
16	council shall deliver a report of the council's findings and
17	recommendations to the governor and the Legislative Budget Board.
18	Sec. 2306.1097. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The council may solicit
19	and accept gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of this
20	subchapter.
21	Sec. 2306.1098. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEES PROVIDING ADVISORY
22	SUPPORT TO COUNCIL. Department employees assigned to provide
23	advisory support to the council shall:
24	(1) identify sources of funding from this state and
25	the federal government that may be used to provide integrated

(2) determine the requirements and application

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Τ	guidelines to obtain those funds;
2	(3) provide training materials that assist the
3	development and financing of a service-enriched housing project;
4	(4) provide information regarding:
5	(A) effective methods to collaborate with
6	governmental entities, service providers, and financial
7	institutions; and
8	(B) the use of layered financing to provide and
9	<pre>finance service-enriched housing;</pre>
10	(5) create a financial feasibility model that assists
11	in making a preliminary determination of the financial viability of
12	proposed service-enriched housing projects, including models that
13	allow a person to analyze multiuse projects that facilitate the
14	development of projects that will:
15	(A) address the needs of communities with
16	different populations; and
17	(B) achieve economies of scale required to make
18	the projects financially viable;
19	(6) facilitate communication between state agencies,
20	sources of funding, service providers, and other entities to reduce
21	or eliminate barriers to service-enriched housing projects;
22	(7) provide training about local, state, and federal
23	funding sources and the requirements for those sources;
24	(8) develop a database to identify, describe, monitor,
25	and track the progress of all service-enriched housing projects
26	<pre>developed in this state with state or federal financial assistance;</pre>
27	(9) conduct a biennial evaluation and include in the

- 2 under Section 2306.1096 information regarding:
- 3 (A) the capacity of statewide long-term care
- 4 providers; and
- 5 (B) interest by housing developers in investing
- 6 in service-enriched housing;
- 7 (10) to increase the consistency in housing
- 8 regulations, recommend changes to home and community-based
- 9 Medicaid waivers that are up for renewal;
- 10 (11) research best practices with respect to
- 11 service-enriched housing projects subsidized by other states; and
- 12 (12) create and maintain a clearinghouse of
- 13 information that contains tools and resources for entities seeking
- 14 to create or finance service-enriched housing projects.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) As soon as possible after the effective
- 16 date of this Act, the governor and the heads of the applicable state
- 17 agencies shall appoint members to the housing and health services
- 18 coordination council in accordance with Subchapter NN, Chapter
- 19 2306, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 20 (b) In making initial appointments to the housing and health
- 21 services coordination council, the governor shall appoint two
- 22 members to serve a term expiring September 1, 2011, three members to
- 23 serve a term expiring September 1, 2013, and three members to serve
- 24 a term expiring September 1, 2015.
- 25 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2010, the housing and
- 26 health services coordination council shall submit the first report
- 27 of the council's findings and recommendations as required by

- 1 Subchapter NN, Chapter 2306, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act does not make an appropriation. A
- 3 provision in this Act that creates a new governmental program,
- 4 creates a new entitlement, or imposes a new duty on a governmental
- 5 entity is not mandatory during a fiscal period for which the
- 6 legislature has not made a specific appropriation to implement the
- 7 provision.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
