1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of genetic counselors;
3	providing penalties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 506 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 506. LICENSED GENETIC COUNSELORS
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 506.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the
10	Licensed Genetic Counselor Act.
11	Sec. 506.002. GENERAL DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
12	(1) "Advisory committee" means the licensed genetic
13	counselor advisory committee.
14	(2) "Board" means the Texas Medical Board.
15	(3) "Executive director" means the executive director
16	of the board.
17	(4) "Licensed genetic counselor" means a person
18	licensed under this chapter to engage in the practice of genetic
19	counseling.
20	Sec. 506.003. DEFINITION: PRACTICE OF GENETIC COUNSELING.
21	In this chapter, "practice of genetic counseling" means, on the
22	documented referral by a physician licensed to practice medicine in
23	this state or by a person acting under authority delegated under
24	Subchapter A, Chapter 157, providing professional services for

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1 compensation to communicate genetic information to an individual, 2 family, group, or other entity. The term includes: (1) assessing the likelihood of an occurrence or 3 recurrence of a birth defect or a potentially inherited or 4 genetically influenced condition, including: 5 6 (A) obtaining and analyzing a complete health 7 history of an individual and family; 8 (B) reviewing <u>pertinent medical records;</u> (C) evaluating the risks associated with 9 10 exposure to possible mutagens or teratogens; and 11 (D) recommending genetic testing to evaluate a 12 condition or determine the carrier status of a family member; (2) assisting an individual, family, or group to: 13 (A) appreciate the medical, psychological, and 14 15 social implications of a disorder, including the disorder's features, variability, usual course, and management options; 16 17 (B) understand the effect genetic factors have on a disorder and on the chance for recurrence of the disorder in other 18 19 family members; (C) understand the options available for coping 20 with, preventing, or reducing the occurrence or recurrence of a 21 22 condition; and (D) understand genetic or prenatal tests and 23 24 coordinate testing for inherited disorders; and 25 (3) facilitating an individual's or family's: 26 (A) examination of the risk and burden perception associated with the disorder; 27

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1	(B) decision-making related to testing or
2	medical interventions consistent with the individual's or family's
3	beliefs, goals, needs, resources, culture, and ethical or moral
4	views; and
5	(C) adjustment and adaptation to the disorder or
6	to the individual's or family's genetic risk by addressing the need
7	for psychological, social, and medical support.
8	Sec. 506.004. PRACTICE OF MEDICINE NOT AUTHORIZED. This
9	chapter does not authorize:
10	(1) the practice of medicine as defined by Subtitle B,
11	Title 3; or
12	(2) the making of a medical diagnosis.
13	Sec. 506.005. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The licensed
14	genetic counselor advisory committee is subject to Chapter 325,
15	Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence
16	as provided by that chapter, the advisory committee is abolished
17	and this chapter expires September 1, 2019.
18	Sec. 506.006. APPLICABILITY; EXEMPTIONS. (a) This chapter
19	does not apply to a physician licensed to practice medicine in this
20	state or a person acting under the delegation and supervision of the
21	physician unless the person is a licensed genetic counselor.
22	(b) A person may engage in the practice of genetic
23	counseling without holding a license under this chapter if the
24	person:
25	(1) is licensed, certified, or registered to practice
26	in this state in a health care related field and engages in an
27	activity or service of genetic counseling but does not use the title

S.B. No. 1879 "genetic counselor" or the term "genetic counseling," except as 1 authorized by Subsection (c), or represent or imply the person is 2 3 licensed as a genetic counselor under this chapter; 4 (2) is a student: 5 (A) pursuing a course of study or engaged in a training program for an occupation regulated by this state and 6 7 acting within the occupation's scope of practice; or (B) enrolled in a board-approved supervised 8 genetic counseling training program and engaged in an activity 9 10 constituting the practice of genetic counseling as a required part of the training program; or 11 12 (3) is a genetic counselor who: (A) is certified by the American Board of Medical 13 Genetics, the American Board of Genetic Counseling, or another 14 15 certification body approved by the board; 16 (B) is not a resident of this state; 17 (C) performs an activity or provides a service in this state for not more than 30 days during any year and the 18 19 activity or service is under the direction and supervision of a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state or a licensed 20 genetic counselor; and 21 22 (D) meets any other requirements established by 23 board rule. 24 (c) A physician licensed to practice medicine in this state or a person acting under the physician's delegation and supervision 25 26 may use the title "genetic counselor," the term "genetic counseling," and any similar title or term. 27

1	(d) A student described by Subsection (b)(2) includes an
2	individual who:
3	(1) is trained as:
4	(A) a genetic counselor and has applied to take
5	the certification examination; or
6	(B) a doctoral medical geneticist and has applied
7	to take the certification examination; and
8	(2) has not failed the certification examination more
9	than two times.
10	[Sections 506.007-506.050 reserved for expansion]
11	SUBCHAPTER B. ADVISORY COMMITTEE
12	Sec. 506.051. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The advisory
13	committee is an informal advisory committee to the board and is not
14	subject to Chapter 2110, Government Code.
15	(b) The advisory committee has no independent rulemaking
16	authority.
17	Sec. 506.052. APPOINTMENT OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The
18	advisory committee consists of seven members appointed by the
19	president of the board as follows:
20	(1) two licensed physician members, one of whom is a
21	board certified obstetrician gynecologist, a board certified
22	oncologist, or a board certified clinical geneticist; and
23	(2) five licensed genetic counselor members, each of
24	whom:
25	(A) has engaged for at least two years in the
26	practice of genetic counseling as a genetic counselor:
27	(i) licensed under this chapter; or

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1	(ii) certified by the American Board of
2	Medical Genetics, the American Board of Genetic Counseling, or
3	another certification body approved by the board;
4	(B) is a United States citizen; and
5	(C) has been a resident of this state for not less
6	than six months preceding appointment.
7	Sec. 506.053. MEMBERSHIP AND EMPLOYEE RESTRICTIONS. (a)
8	In this section, "Texas trade association" means a cooperative and
9	voluntarily joined association of business or professional
10	competitors in this state designed to assist its members and its
11	industry or profession in dealing with mutual business or
12	professional problems and in promoting their common interest.
13	(b) A person may not be a member of the advisory committee
14	<u>if:</u>
15	(1) the person is an officer, employee, or paid
16	consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of genetic
17	counseling; or
18	(2) the person's spouse is an officer, manager, or paid
19	consultant of a Texas trade association in the field of genetic
20	counseling.
21	(c) A person may not be a member of the advisory committee if
22	the person is required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305,
23	Government Code, because of the person's activities for
24	compensation on behalf of a profession related to the field of
25	genetic counseling.
26	Sec. 506.054. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the advisory
27	committee serve two-year terms. The terms of the members expire on

1	February 1 of each odd-numbered year.
2	(b) If a vacancy occurs during a member's term, the
3	president of the board shall appoint a new member to fill the
4	unexpired term.
5	(c) An advisory committee member may not serve more than two
6	consecutive full terms.
7	Sec. 506.055. GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL. (a) It is a ground for
8	removal from the advisory committee that a member:
9	(1) does not have at the time of appointment the
10	qualifications required by Section 506.052;
11	(2) does not maintain during service on the advisory
12	committee the qualifications required by Section 506.052;
13	(3) is ineligible for membership under Section
14	<u>506.053;</u>
15	(4) cannot, because of illness or disability,
16	discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the member's
17	term; or
18	(5) has had a restriction, suspension, or revocation
19	of a license to perform genetic counseling in this state or any
20	other state.
21	(b) The executive director shall review the qualifications
22	of the members of the advisory committee and notify the board of any
23	action that may be required.
24	(c) The validity of an action of the committee is not
25	affected by the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a
26	committee member exists.
27	Sec. 506.056. OFFICERS. The president of the board

1	biennially shall designate a committee member as the presiding	
2	officer of the advisory committee to serve in that capacity at the	
3	will of the president.	
4	Sec. 506.057. PER DIEM. An advisory committee member is not	
5	entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses or compensation.	
6	Sec. 506.058. MEETINGS. (a) The advisory committee shall	
7	meet as requested by the board.	
8	(b) A meeting may be held by telephone or other electronic	
9	conference call.	
10	[Sections 506.059-506.100 reserved for expansion]	
11	SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD	
12	AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR	
13	Sec. 506.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The board, in	
14	consultation with the advisory committee, shall:	
15	(1) establish qualifications for genetic counselors	
16	in this state;	
17	(2) establish requirements for an examination for a	
18	license to practice as a genetic counselor;	
19	(3) establish minimum education and training	
20	requirements necessary for a license as a genetic counselor;	
21	(4) prescribe the application form for a license to	
22	practice as a genetic counselor; and	
23	(5) develop an approved program of mandatory	
24	continuing education and the manner in which attendance at all	
25	approved courses, clinics, forums, lectures, programs, or seminars	
26	is monitored and recorded.	
27	Sec. 506.102. RULES. In consultation with the advisory	

1	committee, the board shall adopt rules to implement and enforce
2	this chapter.
3	Sec. 506.103. FEES; SPECIAL ACCOUNT. (a) The board by rule
4	shall set fees required by this chapter in amounts reasonable and
5	necessary to cover the costs of administering this chapter.
6	(b) The board shall deposit all the fees collected to the
7	credit of the genetic counseling licensing account. The genetic
8	counseling licensing account is a special account in the general
9	revenue fund that may be appropriated only to the board to pay for
10	the board's administration of this chapter.
11	Sec. 506.104. ANNUAL REPORT. (a) The board annually shall
12	prepare a complete and detailed written report accounting for all
13	funds received and disbursed by the board under this chapter during
14	the preceding fiscal year.
15	(b) The annual report must meet the reporting requirements
16	applicable to financial reporting provided by the General
17	Appropriations Act.
18	Sec. 506.105. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to
19	any fees paid to the board or money appropriated to the board, the
20	board may receive and accept under this chapter a gift, grant,
21	donation, or other item of value from any source, including the
22	United States or a private source.
23	[Sections 506.106-506.150 reserved for expansion]
24	SUBCHAPTER D. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION;
25	COMPLAINT AND INVESTIGATIVE INFORMATION
26	Sec. 506.151. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. (a) The board shall
27	develop and implement policies that provide the public with a

1	reasonable opportunity to appear before the board and speak on any
2	issue relating to genetic counseling.
3	(b) The executive director shall prepare and maintain a
4	written plan that describes how a person who does not speak English
5	may be provided reasonable access to the board's programs and
6	services under this chapter.
7	Sec. 506.152. PUBLIC INTEREST INFORMATION. (a) The board
8	shall prepare information of public interest describing the
9	functions of the board under this chapter and the procedure by which
10	complaints are filed and resolved under this chapter.
11	(b) The board shall make the information available to the
12	public and appropriate state agencies.
13	Sec. 506.153. COMPLAINTS. (a) The board by rule shall
14	establish methods by which consumers are notified of the name,
15	mailing address, and telephone number of the board for the purpose
16	of directing complaints about genetic counselors to the board.
17	(b) The board shall list with its regular telephone number
18	any toll-free telephone number established under other state law
19	that may be called to present a complaint about a genetic
20	counselor.
21	Sec. 506.154. RECORDS OF COMPLAINTS. (a) The board shall
22	maintain a file on each written complaint filed with the board under
23	this chapter. The file must include:
24	(1) the name of the person who filed the complaint;
25	(2) the date the complaint is received by the board;
26	(3) the subject matter of the complaint;
27	(4) the name of each person contacted in relation to

## 1 the complaint; 2 (5) a summary of the results of the review or 3 investigation of the complaint; and 4 (6) an explanation of the reason the file was closed, 5 if the board closed the file without taking action other than to investigate the complaint. 6 7 (b) The board shall provide to the person filing the 8 complaint and to each person who is a subject of the complaint a copy of the board's policies and procedures relating to complaint 9 investigation and resolution. A person who reports a complaint by 10 telephone shall be given information on how to file a written 11 12 complaint. (c) The board, at least quarterly and until final 13 14 disposition of the complaint, shall notify the person filing the 15 complaint and each person who is a subject of the complaint of the status of the investigation unless the notice would jeopardize an 16 17 ongoing investigation. Sec. 506.155. LICENSE 18 HOLDER ACCESS ТО COMPLAINT 19 INFORMATION. (a) The board shall provide a genetic counselor who is the subject of a formal complaint filed under this chapter with 20 access to all information in its possession that the board intends 21 to offer into evidence in presenting its case in chief at the 22 contested hearing on the complaint, subject to any other privilege 23 24 or restriction established by rule, statute, or legal precedent. The board shall provide the information not later than the 30th day 25 26 after receipt of a written request from the license holder or the license holder's counsel, unless good cause is shown for delay. 27

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1	(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the board is not
2	required to provide:
3	(1) board investigative reports;
4	(2) investigative memoranda;
5	(3) the identity of a non-testifying complainant;
6	(4) attorney-client communications;
7	(5) attorney work product; or
8	(6) other material covered by a privilege recognized
9	by the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure or the Texas Rules of
10	Evidence.
11	Sec. 506.156. HEALTH CARE ENTITY REQUEST FOR INFORMATION.
12	On the written request of a health care entity, the board shall
13	provide to the entity:
14	(1) information about a complaint filed against the
15	license holder that was resolved after investigation by:
16	(A) a disciplinary order of the board; or
17	(B) an agreed settlement; and
18	(2) the basis of and current status of any complaint
19	under active investigation that has been referred by the executive
20	director or the director's designee for legal action.
21	Sec. 506.157. CONFIDENTIALITY OF INVESTIGATIVE
22	INFORMATION. The following information is privileged and
23	confidential and is not subject to discovery, subpoena, or other
24	means of legal compulsion for release to any person other than the
25	board or board employee or agent involved in license holder
26	discipline:
27	(1) a complaint, adverse report, investigation file,

1 or other report;

2 (2) the identity of and reports made by a physician or
3 licensed genetic counselor performing or supervising compliance or
4 monitoring for the board; or

5 (3) other investigative information in the possession 6 of or received by or gathered by the board, a board employee or 7 agent relating to a license holder, a license application, or a 8 criminal investigation or proceeding.

9 <u>Sec. 506.158. PERMITTED DISCLOSURE OF INVESTIGATIVE</u> 10 <u>INFORMATION. (a) Notwithstanding Section 506.157, investigative</u> 11 <u>information in the possession of the board or a board employee or</u> 12 <u>agent may be disclosed to a licensing authority in another state or</u> 13 <u>country in which the license holder is licensed or has applied for a</u> 14 <u>license or similar authority.</u>

15 (b) If the investigative information in the possession of 16 the board or a board employee or agent indicates a crime may have 17 been committed, the board shall report the information to the proper law enforcement agency. The board shall cooperate with and 18 assist all law enforcement agencies conducting criminal 19 investigations of a license holder by providing information 20 relevant to the investigation. Confidential information disclosed 21 22 by the board to a law enforcement agency remains confidential and may not be disclosed by the law enforcement agency except as 23 24 necessary to further the investigation or prosecution.

25 <u>Sec. 506.159. IMMUNITY AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. (a)</u>
26 <u>Any person, including a physician or genetic counselor, shall</u>
27 <u>report relevant information to the board related to the acts of a</u>

1	licensed genetic counselor in this state if, in that person's
2	opinion, the licensed genetic counselor poses a continuing threat
3	to the public welfare. The duty to report under this section may not
4	be nullified through contract.
5	(b) A person who without malice furnishes records,
6	information, or assistance to the board under this section is
7	immune from any civil liability arising from that action in a suit
8	against the person brought by or on behalf of a licensed genetic
9	counselor who is reported under this section.
10	[Sections 506.160-506.200 reserved for expansion]
11	SUBCHAPTER E. LICENSING REQUIREMENTS
12	Sec. 506.201. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) Except as provided by
13	Section 506.006, a person may not act as a genetic counselor unless
14	that person is licensed under this chapter.
15	(b) Except as provided by Section 506.006(c) or unless the
16	person holds a license under this chapter, a person may not use the
17	title or represent or imply the person has the title "genetic
18	counselor," "certified genetic counselor," "licensed genetic
19	<pre>counselor," "gene counselor," "genetic consultant," "genetic</pre>
20	associate," or any other word, abbreviation, or insignia indicating
21	or implying the person is a licensed genetic counselor.
22	Sec. 506.202. LICENSE APPLICATION. An applicant for a
23	license must:
24	(1) file a written application with the board on a form
25	prescribed by the board; and
26	(2) pay the application fee set by the board.
27	Sec. 506.203. LICENSE ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be eligible for

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1	a license, a license applicant must demonstrate to the satisfaction
2	of the board that the applicant:
3	(1) is of good moral character;
4	(2) has not been convicted of a felony or a crime
5	involving moral turpitude;
6	(3) has not used drugs or alcohol to an extent that
7	affects the applicant's professional competency;
8	(4) has not had a certificate of registration or
9	license revoked by a licensing agency or by a certifying
10	professional organization; and
11	(5) has not engaged in fraud or deceit in applying for
12	a license under this chapter.
13	(b) In addition to meeting the requirements of Subsection
14	(a), an applicant must:
15	(1) successfully complete the examination required by
16	Section 506.204;
17	(2) have successfully completed:
18	(A) a master's degree in a genetic counseling
19	training program that is approved by the board and that is at least
20	as stringent as a genetic counseling training program accredited by
21	the American Board of Genetic Counselors; or
22	(B) a master's degree in a medical genetics
23	training program that is approved by the board and that is at least
24	as stringent as a medical genetics training program accredited by
25	the American Board of Medical Genetics; and
26	(3) meet any other requirement prescribed by the
27	board.

Sec. 506.204. EXAMINATION. (a) An applicant for a license 1 under this chapter must successfully complete an examination 2 approved by the board that demonstrates the applicant's knowledge 3 of genetic counseling. 4 5 (b) The board shall adopt rules to govern the development and administration of an examination for a license as a genetic 6 7 counselor under this chapter. Any written portion of the examination must be validated by an independent testing 8 9 professional. Sec. 506.205. TEMPORARY LICENSE. (a) The board may, 10 through the executive director, issue a temporary license to an 11 12 applicant who: 13 (1) submits an application on a form prescribed by the 14 board; 15 (2) has successfully completed the examination required by the board; 16 17 (3) pays the appropriate fee set by the board; and (4) meets all the qualifications for a license under 18 19 this chapter and is waiting for the next scheduled meeting of the board for the license to be issued. 20 21 (b) A temporary license is valid until the 100th day after the date issued and may be extended until the 130th day after the 22 date issued. 23 24 Sec. 506.206. ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF LICENSE. The board shall issue a license as a genetic counselor to a person who meets 25 26 the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted under this 27 chapter.

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1 Sec. 506.207. TERM; RENEWAL. (a) A license as a genetic 2 counselor expires on the second anniversary of the date of issuance. The board by rule shall provide for the renewal of a 3 license as a genetic counselor. 4 5 (b) The board by rule may adopt a system under which licenses expire on various dates during the year. For the year in 6 7 which the license expiration date is changed, license fees shall be 8 prorated on a monthly basis so that each license holder pays only that portion of the license fee that is allocable to the number of 9 months during which the license or license renewal is valid. On 10 renewal of the license on the new expiration date, the total license 11 12 renewal fee is payable. Sec. 506.208. NOTICE OF LICENSE RENEWAL. At least 30 days 13 before the expiration of a person's license, the board shall send 14 15 written notice of the impending license expiration to the license holder's last known address according to the records of the board. 16 17 Sec. 506.209. PROCEDURE FOR RENEWAL. (a) A person who is otherwise eligible to renew a license may renew an unexpired 18 19 license by paying the required renewal fee to the board before the expiration date of the license. A person whose license has expired 20 may not engage in activities that require a license. 21 22 (b) If the person's license has been expired for 90 days or less, the person may renew the license by paying to the board one 23 24 and one-half times the required renewal fee. (c) If the person's license has been expired for longer than 25 26 90 days but less than one year, the person may renew the license by paying to the board two times the required renewal fee. 27

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1	(d) If the person's license has been expired for one year or
2	longer, the person may not renew the license. The person may obtain
3	a new license by complying with the requirements and procedures for
4	obtaining an original license.
5	[Sections 506.210-506.300 reserved for expansion]
6	SUBCHAPTER F. DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS
7	Sec. 506.301. DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS BY BOARD. (a) On a
8	determination that an applicant or license holder committed an act
9	or attempted to commit an act described by Section 506.302,
10	506.303, or 506.304, the board by order may take any of the
11	following actions:
12	(1) deny the person's license application or revoke
13	the person's license;
14	(2) require the person to complete additional
15	training;
16	(3) stay the enforcement of an order and place the
17	person on probation;
18	(4) require the person to submit to the care,
19	counseling, or treatment of a health care practitioner designated
20	by the board;
21	(5) suspend, limit, or restrict the person's license,
22	including:
23	(A) limiting the practice of the person to or
24	excluding from the person's practice, one or more of the specified
25	activities of genetic counseling; or
26	(B) stipulating periodic board review;
27	(6) assess an administrative penalty against the

1	person as provided by Section 506.351; or
2	(7) administer a public reprimand.
3	(b) If the board stays enforcement of an order and places a
4	person on probation, the board retains the right to vacate the
5	probationary stay and enforce the original order for noncompliance
6	with the terms of probation or impose any other remedial measure or
7	sanction authorized by this section.
8	(c) The board may restore or reissue a license or remove any
9	disciplinary or corrective measure that the board has imposed.
10	Sec. 506.302. CONDUCT RELATED TO MISREPRESENTATION OR
11	FRAUD. The board may take action under Section 506.301 against an
12	applicant or a license holder who:
13	(1) fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to
14	<u>obtain a license;</u>
15	(2) fraudulently or deceptively uses a license;
16	(3) falsely represents that the person is a physician,
17	nurse, physician assistant, or other licensed health care provider;
18	(4) acts in an unprofessional or dishonorable manner
19	that is likely to deceive, defraud, or injure the public;
20	(5) fraudulently alters any license;
21	(6) uses any genetic counselor license that has been
22	fraudulently purchased, issued, or counterfeited or that has been
23	<pre>materially altered;</pre>
24	(7) directly or indirectly aids or abets the practice
25	of genetic counseling by any person not licensed by the board to
26	practice as a genetic counselor; or
27	(8) unlawfully advertises in a false, misleading, or

1	deceptive manner as defined in Section 101.201.
2	Sec. 506.303. CONDUCT RELATED TO VIOLATION OF LAW. (a) The
3	board may take action under Section 506.301 against an applicant or
4	license holder who:
5	(1) violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this
6	chapter;
7	(2) is convicted of a felony, placed on deferred
8	adjudication, or placed in a pretrial diversion program; or
9	(3) violates state law if the violation is connected
10	with the practice of genetic counseling.
11	(b) A complaint, indictment, or conviction of a law
12	violation is not necessary for the board to act under Subsection
13	(a)(3). Proof of the commission of the act while in practice as a
14	genetic counselor or under the guise of a genetic counselor is
15	sufficient for action by the board.
16	Sec. 506.304. CONDUCT INDICATING LACK OF FITNESS. (a) The
17	board may take action under Section 506.301 against an applicant or
18	license holder who:
19	(1) habitually uses drugs or intoxicating liquors to
20	the extent that, in the board's opinion, the person cannot safely
21	act as a genetic counselor;
22	(2) has been adjudicated as mentally incompetent;
23	(3) has a mental or physical condition that renders
24	the person unable to safely act as a genetic counselor;

Sec. 506.305. SUBPOENA. (a) The executive director, the 18 19 director's designee, or the secretary-treasurer of the board may issue a subpoena or subpoena duces tecum: 20 21 (1) to conduct an investigation or a contested case proceeding related to: 22 (A) alleged misconduct by a genetic counselor; 23 24 (B) an alleged violation of this chapter or 25 another law related to the practice of a genetic counselor; or 26 (C) the practice of genetic counseling under this 27 chapter;
