A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the fund for veterans' assistance.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subsections (a), (c), and (e), Section 434.017,
- 5 Government Code, as redesignated and amended by Chapter 1418 (H.B.
- 6 3107), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The fund for veterans' assistance is a special fund in
- 9 the state treasury outside the general revenue fund. The fund is
- 10 composed of:
- 11 (1) money transferred to the fund at the direction of
- 12 the legislature;
- 13 (2) money deposited to the credit of the fund under
- 14 Section 502.1746, Transportation Code;
- 15 (3) gifts and grants contributed to the fund; and
- 16 (4) $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ the earnings of the fund.
- 17 (c) Money in the fund may be appropriated to the Texas
- 18 Veterans Commission to:
- 19 (1) enhance or improve veterans' assistance programs,
- 20 including veterans' representation and counseling; [and]
- 21 (2) make grants to [local communities to] address
- 22 veterans' needs; and
- 23 (3) administer the fund.
- (e) To carry out any purpose of this chapter, the Texas

- 1 Veterans Commission may solicit and accept a gift, grant, devise,
- 2 bequest of money, security, service, or property, including money
- 3 raised or a service provided by a volunteer or volunteer group, to
- 4 promote the work of the commission. The commission may participate
- 5 in the establishment and operation of an affiliated nonprofit
- 6 organization that is established for the purpose of raising money
- 7 for or providing services or other benefits to the commission [The
- 8 comptroller may solicit and accept gifts and grants to the
- 9 fund]. A gift, [or] grant, devise, or bequest to the fund may be
- 10 appropriated in the same manner as other money in the fund, subject
- 11 to any limitation or requirement placed on the gift, [or] grant,
- 12 <u>devise</u>, or bequest by the donor or granting entity.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 434, Government Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 434.0171 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 434.0171. STATE EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTIONS TO FUND FOR
- 16 VETERANS' ASSISTANCE. For purposes of Subchapter I, Chapter 659:
- 17 <u>(1) the Texas Veterans Commission, for the sole</u>
- 18 purpose of managing the fund for veterans' assistance, is
- 19 considered an eligible charitable organization entitled to
- 20 participate in the state employee charitable campaign; and
- 21 (2) a state employee is entitled to authorize a
- 22 <u>deduction for contributions to the Texas Veterans Commission for</u>
- 23 the purposes of managing the fund for veterans' assistance as a
- 24 charitable contribution under Section 659.132, and the Texas
- 25 Veterans Commission may use the contributions for the purposes
- 26 <u>listed in Section 434.017(c)</u>, as redesignated and amended by
- 27 Chapter 1418 (H.B. 3107), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular

- 1 <u>Session, 2007.</u>
- 2 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,
- 3 is amended by adding Section 502.1746 to read as follows:
- 4 <u>Sec. 502.1746. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION</u> TO VETERANS'
- 5 ASSISTANCE FUND. (a) When a person registers a motor vehicle
- 6 under this chapter, the person is entitled to make a voluntary
- 7 contribution in any amount to the fund for veterans' assistance
- 8 established by Section 434.017, Government Code, as redesignated
- 9 and amended by Chapter 1418 (H.B. 3107), Acts of the 80th
- 10 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007.
- 11 (b) The county assessor-collector shall send any
- 12 contribution made under this section to the comptroller for deposit
- 13 in the state treasury to the credit of the fund for veterans'
- 14 <u>assistance before the 31st day after the date the contribution is</u>
- 15 made.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
