## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation and duties of the state energy savings
3	performance contract advisory council.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 10, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2178 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2178. STATE ENERGY SAVINGS PERFORMANCE CONTRACT
8	ADVISORY COUNCIL
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 2178.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Advisory council" means the state energy savings
12	performance contract advisory council.
13	(2) "Energy savings" means an estimated reduction in
14	net fuel costs, energy costs, water costs, storm-water fees, other
15	utility costs, or related net operating costs from, or as compared
16	to, an established baseline of those costs. The term does not
17	include an estimated reduction due to a decrease in energy rates
18	that is not derived from increased conservation or reduced usage.
19	(3) "Energy savings performance contract" means a
20	contract between a state agency or an institution of higher
21	education and a provider for energy or water conservation or usage
22	measures in which the estimated energy savings, increase in
23	billable revenues, or increase in meter accuracy resulting from the

measures is subject to guarantee to offset the cost of the energy or

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term includes a contract for the installation or implementation of
the following, including all causally connected work:

(A) insulation of a building structure and
systems within the building;

(B) storm windows or doors, caulking or weather
stripping, multiglazed windows or doors, heat-absorbing or
heat-reflective glazed and coated window or door systems, or other

water conservation or usage measures over a specified period. The

window or door system modifications that reduce energy consumption;

(C) automatic energy control systems, including

- 13 system modifications or replacements that reduce energy or water
- 14 consumption;

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- 15 (E) lighting fixtures that increase energy
- 16 efficiency;
- 17 <u>(F) energy recovery systems;</u>
- 18 (G) electric systems improvements;
- 19 (H) water-conserving fixtures, appliances, and
- 20 equipment or the substitution of non-water-using fixtures,
- 21 appliances, and equipment;
- 22 <u>(I) water-conserving landscape irrigation</u>
- 23 <u>equipment;</u>
- (J) landscaping measures that reduce watering
- 25 demands and capture and hold applied water and rainfall, including:
- 26 (i) landscape contouring, including the use
- 27 of berms, swales, and terraces; and

1	(ii) the use of soil amendments that
2	increase the water-holding capacity of the soil, including compost;
3	(K) rainwater harvesting equipment and equipment
4	to make use of water collected as part of a storm-water system
5	installed for water quality control;
6	(L) equipment for recycling or reuse of water
7	originating on the premises or from other sources, including
8	treated municipal effluent;
9	(M) equipment needed to capture water from
10	nonconventional, alternate sources, including air-conditioning
11	condensate or graywater, for nonpotable uses;
12	(N) metering or related equipment or systems that
13	improve the accuracy of billable-revenue-generation systems; or
14	(O) other energy or water conservation-related
15	improvements or equipment, including improvements or equipment
16	relating to renewable energy or nonconventional water sources or
17	water reuse.
18	(4) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
19	assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
20	(5) "State agency" means an office, department,
21	commission, or board of any branch of state government.
22	Sec. 2178.002. ADMINISTRATIVELY ATTACHED TO COMPTROLLER'S
23	OFFICE. The advisory council is administratively attached to the
24	comptroller's office. The comptroller shall provide the staff and
25	facilities necessary to assist the advisory council in performing
26	its duties.

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1	SUBCHAPTER B. ADVISORY COUNCIL
2	Sec. 2178.051. ESTABLISHMENT OF ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) The
3	comptroller shall establish the state energy savings performance
4	contract advisory council as an independent council separate from
5	the state energy conservation office.
6	(b) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the advisory council.
7	Sec. 2178.052. APPOINTMENT OF ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERS.
8	(a) The comptroller shall appoint the members of the advisory
9	<pre>council. The advisory council must include:</pre>
10	(1) at least one representative from each of the
11	following:
12	(A) an institution of higher education;
13	(B) a state agency, other than an agency already
14	represented on the advisory council;
15	(C) the state energy conservation office;
16	(D) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
17	Board;
18	(E) the Bond Review Board;
19	(F) the Texas Public Finance Authority;
20	(G) the attorney general's office;
21	(H) the Texas Water Development Board; and
22	(I) the Texas Engineering Experiment Station;
23	(2) a licensed professional mechanical engineer, who
24	is licensed in this state and is proficient in monitoring and
25	verification techniques; and
26	(3) a representative from the energy savings
27	performance contract industry.

- 1 (b) The advisory council members serve four-year terms. An
- 2 advisory council member may be reappointed for a second term.
- 3 (c) Not later than the 90th day after the date the
- 4 comptroller receives notice of a member's resignation, the
- 5 comptroller shall fill the vacancy on the advisory council.
- 6 Sec. 2178.053. PRESIDING OFFICER. The members of the
- 7 advisory council by majority vote shall appoint a presiding
- 8 <u>officer.</u>
- 9 Sec. 2178.054. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. An advisory
- 10 council member is not entitled to compensation or reimbursement of
- 11 travel expenses for serving on the council.
- Sec. 2178.055. MEETINGS. The advisory council shall meet
- 13 at the call of the presiding officer or comptroller.

- 15 SUBCHAPTER C. DUTIES OF ADVISORY COUNCIL
- Sec. 2178.101. GENERAL DUTIES. The advisory council shall
- 17 advise the comptroller, state agencies, and institutions of higher
- 18 education with regard to:
- 19 (1) optimizing energy savings;
- 20 (2) complying with the requirements for energy savings
- 21 performance contracts;
- 22 (3) verifying energy savings; and
- 23 (4) overseeing contracts for energy services and
- 24 energy conservation measures under performance contracts that
- 25 guarantee savings.
- Sec. 2178.102. BEST PRACTICES. (a) The advisory council
- 27 shall identify strategies for state agencies and institutions of

- 1 higher education to use in measuring and verifying savings from
- 2 energy, water, improved operations and maintenance,
- 3 retro-commissioning, renewable energy, and cogeneration projects
- 4 implemented through energy savings performance contracts.
- 5 (b) The advisory council shall base the strategies
- 6 identified under Subsection (a) on best practices identified by
- 7 other entities, including:
- 8 <u>(1) ASHRAE Guideline 14: Measurement of Energy and</u>
- 9 Demand Savings;
- 10 (2) the International Performance Measurement and
- 11 Verification Protocol; and
- 12 (3) the Federal Energy Management Program Guidelines
- 13 for Measurement and Verification for Federal Energy Management
- 14 Projects.
- Sec. 2178.103. REPORTS. (a) Not later than January 1 of
- 16 each odd-numbered year, the advisory council shall submit a report
- 17 to the governor and both houses of the legislature on:
- 18 (1) the savings or lack of savings of all energy
- 19 savings performance contracts entered into by a state agency or an
- 20 institution of higher education during the preceding two years and
- 21 on the performance of contractors under the contracts; and
- (2) the fulfillment of state agency energy savings
- 23 reduction goals under Section 2166.406 of this code and of
- 24 <u>institutions of higher education energy savings reduction goals</u>
- 25 under Section 51.927, Education Code.
- 26 (b) The report required under Subsection (a) may also
- 27 contain recommendations for increased savings by state agencies and

- 1 institutions of higher education, including the use of energy
- 2 savings performance contracts and other forms of financing.
- 3 (c) Each state agency and institution of higher education
- 4 shall provide to the advisory council adequate, timely information
- 5 necessary to prepare the report.
- 6 (d) Each state agency and institution of higher education
- 7 shall provide to the advisory council a list of all energy savings
- 8 performance contracts that includes:
- 9 <u>(1) a summary of the savings and operational</u>
- 10 performance under the contract;
- 11 (2) a statement that the savings guarantee is or is not
- 12 being met annually; and
- 13 (3) a statement on the impact of the contract:
- 14 (A) for a state agency, on the agency's request
- 15 to the legislature for utility funding; or
- 16 (B) for institutions of higher education, on
- 17 student fees and tuition.
- SECTION 2. Section 2166.406, Government Code, is amended by
- 19 adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
- 20 (k) An energy savings performance contract must comply with
- 21 any requirements established under Chapter 2178.
- SECTION 3. Section 51.927, Education Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
- 24 (k) An energy savings performance contract must comply with
- 25 any requirements established under Chapter 2178, Government Code.
- SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 27 of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts shall appoint

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- 1 members to the state energy savings performance contract advisory
- 2 council.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
