## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the adoption of uniform residential building codes by
- 3 political subdivisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 214.212(a) and (d), Local Government
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) To protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the
- 8 International Residential Code, as it existed on May 1, 2008
- 9 [2001], is adopted as a municipal residential building code in this
- 10 state.
- 11 (d) A municipality may review and consider amendments made
- 12 by the International Code Council to the International Residential
- 13 Code after May 1, 2008 [2001].
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 214.214(a), Local Government Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the National
- 17 Electrical Code, as it existed on May 1, 2008 [2001], is adopted as
- 18 the municipal electrical construction code in this state and
- 19 applies to all residential and commercial electrical construction
- 20 applications.
- 21 SECTION 3. Sections 214.216(a) and (d), Local Government
- 22 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) To protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the
- 24 International Building Code, as it existed on May 1, 2008 [2003], is

- 1 adopted as a municipal commercial building code in this state.
- 2 (d) A municipality may review and consider amendments made
- 3 by the International Code Council to the International Building
- 4 Code after May 1, 2008 [<del>2003</del>].
- 5 SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 214, Local Government
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 214.217 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 214.217. CONFLICTS WITH OTHER BUILDING CODES. A
- 8 <u>building-related code adopted by state statute</u>, including the
- 9 energy code adopted by Chapter 388, Health and Safety Code,
- 10 prevails to the extent of any conflict with an ordinance, including
- 11 <u>a local amendment to a code</u>, adopted under this subchapter.
- 12 SECTION 5. Chapter 233, Local Government Code, is amended
- 13 by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
- 14 SUBCHAPTER E. BUILDING CODES IN CERTAIN COUNTIES
- Sec. 233.151. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
- 16 to a county with a population of 25,000 or more any part of which is
- 17 located within 100 miles of the Gulf of Mexico.
- 18 Sec. 233.152. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 19 (1) "International Residential Code" means the
- 20 International Residential Code for One- and Two-Family Dwellings
- 21 promulgated by the International Code Council.
- 22 (2) "National Electrical Code" means the electrical
- 23 code published by the National Fire Protection Association.
- 24 (3) "Residential" means having the character of a
- 25 <u>detached one-family or two-family dwelling or a multiple</u>
- 26 single-family dwelling that is not more than three stories high
- 27 with separate means of egress, including the accessory structures

- 1 of the dwelling, and that does not have the character of a facility
- 2 used for the accommodation of transient guests or a structure in
- 3 which medical, rehabilitative, or assisted living services are
- 4 provided in connection with the occupancy of the structure.
- 5 Sec. 233.153. INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE. (a) To
- 6 protect the public health, safety, and welfare, each county subject
- 7 to this subchapter by order shall adopt the International
- 8 Residential Code, as it existed on May 1, 2008, as a residential
- 9 building code in the unincorporated area of the county.
- 10 (b) The International Residential Code applies to all
- 11 construction, alteration, remodeling, enlargement, and repair of
- 12 residential structures in the unincorporated area of the county.
- 13 (c) The county may establish procedures:
- 14 (1) to adopt local amendments to the International
- 15 Residential Code; and
- 16 (2) for the administration and enforcement of the
- 17 International Residential Code.
- 18 (d) The county may review and consider amendments made by
- 19 the International Code Council to the International Residential
- 20 Code after May 1, 2008.
- Sec. 233.154. EXCEPTIONS. (a) The International
- 22 Residential Code does not apply to the installation and maintenance
- 23 <u>of electrical wiring and related components.</u>
- 24 (b) A county subject to this subchapter is not required to
- 25 review and consider adoption of amendments to the International
- 26 Residential Code regarding electrical provisions.
- Sec. 233.155. NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE. (a) Each county

- 1 subject to this subchapter by order shall adopt the National
- 2 Electrical Code, as it existed on May 1, 2008, as the county
- 3 electrical construction code for residential structures.
- 4 (b) The National Electrical Code applies to all residential
- 5 construction applications under this subchapter.
- 6 (c) The county may establish procedures:
- 7 (1) to adopt local amendments to the National
- 8 Electrical Code; and
- 9 (2) for the administration and enforcement of the
- 10 National Electrical Code.
- 11 Sec. 233.156. CONFLICTS WITH OTHER BUILDING CODES. To the
- 12 extent of any conflict with an order adopted under this subchapter:
- 13 (1) a municipal ordinance prevails within the
- 14 municipality's jurisdiction; and
- 15 (2) a building-related code adopted by state statute,
- 16 including the energy code adopted by Chapter 388, Health and Safety
- 17 Code, prevails.
- 18 <u>Sec. 233.157. EXISTING COUNTY AUTHORITY UNAFFECTED.</u> The
- 19 authority granted by this subchapter does not affect the authority
- 20 of the commissioners court of a county to adopt an order or
- 21 ordinance under other law.
- SECTION 6. Before January 1, 2010, each county subject to
- 23 Subchapter E, Chapter 233, Local Government Code, as added by this
- 24 Act, shall take the actions necessary to implement that subchapter.
- 25 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
