13	(b) The account consists of:
14	(1) money allocated under the American Recovery and
15	Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Pub. L. No. 111-5) or any other similar
16	federal legislation that is enacted on or after January 1, 2009, for
17	improving the provision of and quality of infant and toddler care;
18	(2) all money appropriated for the purposes of this

- (3) any gifts, grants, or donations received for the 20

- (4) interest earned on money in the account. 22
- (c) The account is exempt from the application of Section 23
- 403.095, Government Code. 24

1 (d) The purpose of the account is to: 2 (1) carry out federal directives under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Pub. L. No. 111-5) or any 3 other similar federal legislation that is enacted on or after 4 January 1, 2009; 5 6 (2) fund continuing education initiatives that 7 implement infant and toddler child-care best practices for 8 caregivers; and 9 (3) provide financial support to: 10 (A) parent and consumer education initiatives; 11 and (B) collaborations with the Early Head Start 12 13 program. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17

Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
