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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of certain research. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 3 SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 10, Government Code, 4 is 5 amended by adding Chapter 2312 to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 2312. REGULATION OF CERTAIN RESEARCH 7 Sec. 2312.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: (1) "Institutional review board" includes an 8 9 independent ethics committee or ethical review board designated to approve research by the United States Department of Health and 10 Human Services, the United States Food and Drug Administration, or 11 any other federal agency or entity. 12 (2) "Permit" means a license, certificate, approval, 13 14 registration, consent, permit, contract, or other agreement related to conducting research in this state or other form of 15 16 authorization required by law, rule, order, or ordinance that a 17 person must obtain from a regulatory agency to conduct research in this state or initiate, continue, or complete a project for which a 18 permit is sought. 19 20 (3) "Project" means research over which a regulatory agency exerts its jurisdiction and for which one or more permits are 21 required to initiate, continue, or complete the research. 22 23 (4) "Regulatory agency" means this state or a political subdivision of this state and includes a bureau, 24

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1 department, division, board, commission, or other agency of this state or the governing body of that entity. 2 (5) "Research" means a scientific endeavor for which 3 4 approval by an institutional review board is required. 5 Sec. 2312.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter 6 applies only to a project conducted through: 7 (1) a public or private institution of higher 8 education in this state; or (2) a business entity authorized to engage in business 9 10 in this state. Sec. 2312.003. DATE OF VESTING OF PROJECT. (a) Subject to 11 12 Subsection (b), a project vests on the date an institutional review 13 board issues an initial approval of a project. 14 (b) A project for which an institutional review board issues 15 an initial approval before September 1, 2009, vests on September 1, 16 2009. 17 Sec. 2312.004. EFFECT OF VESTING. When a project is vested, an applicant for a permit from a regulatory agency in relation to 18 19 the project is entitled to the rights described by this chapter. Sec. 2312.005. ENTITLEMENT TO UNIFORMITY OF REQUIREMENTS. 20 An applicant for a permit from a regulatory agency for a project 21 vested as provided by Section 2312.003, including a permit for a 22 part of the project, is entitled to have the regulatory agency 23 24 consider the approval, disapproval, or conditional approval of the permit solely on the basis of any order, ordinance, rule, 25 26 expiration date, or other properly adopted requirement in effect on 27 the date the project vested.

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Sec. 2312.006. ENTITLEMENT APPLIES TO SUBSEQUENT RESEARCH 1 AND COMMERCIALIZATION. The right described by Section 2312.005 in 2 3 relation to a project or a part of a project begins on the date the project vests and continues: 4 5 (1) through scientific endeavor subsequent to the 6 original research, without regard to whether the endeavor requires approval by an institutional review board, if the endeavor 7 8 continues or relates to the purposes of the project; and

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9 (2) through commercialization efforts subsequent to 10 the original research if those efforts continue or relate to the 11 purposes of the project.

<u>Sec. 2312.007. SERIES OF PERMITS. (a) If a series of</u> <u>permits from a regulatory agency is required for a project, the</u> <u>order, ordinance, rule, expiration date, or other properly adopted</u> <u>requirement in effect on the date the original application for the</u> <u>first permit in that series is filed shall be the sole basis for</u> <u>consideration of all subsequent permits required for completion of</u> the project.

(b) All permits required for a project from a regulatory
agency are considered to be a single series of permits.

21 <u>Sec. 2312.008. CHANGE IN DURATION. On or after the date</u> 22 <u>that a project is vested, a regulatory agency may not shorten the</u> 23 <u>duration of any permit required for the project.</u>

24 <u>Sec. 2312.009. PERMIT CHANGES THAT BENEFIT PROJECT.</u> 25 <u>Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a permit</u> 26 <u>holder may take advantage of a change to the law relating to a</u> 27 regulatory agency or a rule or ordinance of a regulatory agency that

1 benefits, enhances, or protects the project, including changes that lengthen the effective life of the permit after the date the project 2 3 vested, without forfeiting any right under this chapter. 4 Sec. 2312.010. TECHNICAL PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. This chapter 5 does not prohibit a regulatory agency from requiring compliance with a technical requirement relating to the form and content of an 6 application for a permit for a project in effect at the time the 7 8 application is filed, even if the application is filed after the date the project is vested. 9 Sec. 2312.011. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to a 10 change relating to a permit for a project that a regulatory agency 11 12 has adopted on or after the date the project vested if the change: (1) is enacted solely to address an imminent threat of 13 14 destruction of property or injury to a person; or 15 (2) results in an increased fee for the permit if the increase is reasonably related to the administrative costs 16 17 associated with issuing the permit. Sec. 2312.012. ENFORCEMENT OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter 18 19 may be enforced only through mandamus or declaratory or injunctive 20 relief. 21 (b) The immunity of a regulatory agency from suit is waived 22 for an action under this chapter. 23 SECTION 2. This Act applies to a research project without regard to whether the project began before, on, or after the 24 effective date of this Act. 25 26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
