Section 30.05(a), Penal Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A person commits an offense if the person [he] enters or remains on or in property of another, including residential land, 8 9 agricultural land, a recreational vehicle park, a building, or an aircraft or other vehicle, [of another] without effective consent 10 [or he enters or remains in a building of another without effective 11 12 consent] and the person [he]: (1) had notice that the entry was forbidden; or 13 14 (2) received notice to depart but failed to do so. SECTION 2. Section 30.05(b), Penal Code, is amended by 15 16 adding Subdivisions (8), (9), and (10) to read as follows: (8) "Recognized state" means another state with which 17 the attorney general of this state, with the approval of the 18 19 governor of this state, negotiated an agreement after determining that the other state: 20 21 (A) has firearm proficiency requirements for 22 peace officers; and 23 (B) fully recognizes the right of peace officers commissioned in this state to carry weapons in the other state. 24

No. 2094 "Recreational vehicle park" means a tract of land 1 (9) that has rental spaces for two or more recreational vehicles, as 2 defined by Section 522.004, Transportation Code. 3 4 (10) "Residential land" means real property improved 5 by a dwelling and zoned for or otherwise authorized for single-family or multifamily use. 6 7 SECTION 3. Sections 30.05(d) and (e), Penal Code, are 8 amended to read as follows: (d) An offense under this section [Subsection (e) is a Class 9 10 C misdemeanor unless it is committed in a habitation or unless the actor carries a deadly weapon on or about the actor's person during 11 the commission of the offense, in which event it is a Class A 12 misdemeanor. An offense under Subsection (a) is a Class C [B] 13 14 misdemeanor, except that the offense is: 15 (1) a Class B misdemeanor if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the defendant has been previously convicted of 16 17 an offense under this section; and (2) a Class A misdemeanor if: 18 19 (A) $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ the offense is committed: 20 (i) [(A)] in a habitation or a shelter 21 center; (ii) [(B)] on a Superfund site; or 2.2 23 <u>(iii)</u> [(C)] on or in а critical 24 infrastructure facility; or 25 (B) [(2)] the person [actor] carries a deadly 26 weapon [on or about his person] during the commission of the 27 offense.

(e) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that 1 the actor at the time of the offense was [A person commits an 2 offense if without express consent or if without authorization 3 provided by any law, whether in writing or other form, the person]: 4 a firefighter or emergency medical services 5 (1) personnel, as defined by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code, 6 7 acting in the lawful discharge of an official duty under exigent circumstances [enters or remains on agricultural land of another]; 8 9 or 10 (2) a person who was: (A) employed by or acting as agent for an entity, 11 12 including an electric utility, as defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code, or a gas utility, as defined by Section 101.003 or 13 121.001, Utilities Code, that had, or that the person reasonably 14 15 believed had, effective consent or authorization provided by law to enter the property; and 16 17 (B) performing a duty within the scope of that employment or agency [is on the agricultural land and within 100 18 feet of the boundary of the land when apprehended; and 19 [(3) had notice that the entry was forbidden 20 received notice to depart but failed to do so]. 21 SECTION 4. Sections 30.05(c) and (j), Penal Code, are 22 23 repealed. 24 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only 25 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.

26 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is27 covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the

1 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 2 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 3 this Act if any element of the offense was committed before that 4 date.
