A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a requirement to provide sufficient water pressure for
- 3 fire suppression in certain special utility districts.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 13.254(a), Water Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commission at any time after notice and hearing may,
- 8 on its own motion or on receipt of a petition described by
- 9 Subsection (a-1), revoke or amend any certificate of public
- 10 convenience and necessity with the written consent of the
- 11 certificate holder or if it finds that:
- 12 (1) the certificate holder has never provided, is no
- 13 longer providing, is incapable of providing, or has failed to
- 14 provide continuous and adequate service in the area, or part of the
- 15 area, covered by the certificate;
- 16 (2) in an affected county as defined in Section
- 17 16.341, the cost of providing service by the certificate holder is
- 18 so prohibitively expensive as to constitute denial of service,
- 19 provided that, for commercial developments or for residential
- 20 developments started after September 1, 1997, in an affected county
- 21 as defined in Section 16.341, the fact that the cost of obtaining
- 22 service from the currently certificated retail public utility makes
- 23 the development economically unfeasible does not render such cost
- 24 prohibitively expensive in the absence of other relevant factors;

- 1 (3) the certificate holder has agreed in writing to
- 2 allow another retail public utility to provide service within its
- 3 service area, except for an interim period, without amending its
- 4 certificate; [or]
- 5 (4) the certificate holder has failed to file a cease
- 6 and desist action pursuant to Section 13.252 within 180 days of the
- 7 date that it became aware that another retail public utility was
- 8 providing service within its service area, unless the certificate
- 9 holder demonstrates good cause for its failure to file such action
- 10 within the 180 days; or
- 11 (5) the certificate holder has failed to comply with
- 12 Section 65.301.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 65, Water Code, is amended
- 14 by adding Section 65.301 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 65.301. WATER PRESSURE ADEQUATE FOR FIRE SUPPRESSION.
- 16 (a) This section applies only to a district whose territory
- 17 includes land in the corporate limits or extraterritorial
- 18 jurisdiction of a municipality with a population of more than
- 19 10,000.
- 20 (b) A district shall maintain and make available for fire
- 21 suppression a system that, when tested according to procedures
- 22 prescribed by commission rules, is capable of producing at least
- 23 <u>250 gallons per minute.</u>
- 24 (c) The commission shall revoke a district's certificate of
- 25 convenience and necessity under Section 13.254(a) on finding that
- 26 the district is in violation of this section.
- 27 SECTION 3. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality

- 1 shall adopt rules as necessary to implement and enforce Section
- 2 65.301, Water Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
