## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to publication of notice for certain transactions 2
- 3 involving local government entities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 44.031, Education Code, is amended by 5
- 6 adding Subsections (g-1) and (g-2) to read as follows:
- (g-1) If a school district maintains an Internet website, 7
- 8 the district, instead of meeting the publication requirements under
- 9 Subsection (g), may:

- 10 (1) publish notice in a newspaper described by
- Subsection (g) once not later than the 14th day before the bid 11
- 12 receipt deadline; and
- 13 (2) post notice continuously on its website for at
- 14 least 14 days immediately preceding the bid receipt deadline.
- 15 (g-2) The newspaper notice under Subsection (g-1) must
- include the time and place at which the bids will be publicly opened 16
- 17 and the website address for the procurement information.
- SECTION 2. Section 252.041, Local Government Code, 18
- amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and 19
- (a-2) to read as follows: 20
- 21 (a) Ιf the competitive sealed procurement [bidding]
- 22 requirement applies to the contract, notice of the time and place at
- which the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud must be 23
- 24 published at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a

- 1 newspaper published in the municipality. The date of the first
- 2 publication must be before the 14th day before the date set to
- 3 publicly open the bids and read them aloud. If no newspaper is
- 4 published in the municipality, the notice must be posted at the city
- 5 hall for 14 days before the date set to publicly open the bids and
- 6 read them aloud. <u>In a two-step procurement process, the time and</u>
- 7 place where the second-step bids, proposals, or responses will be
- 8 received are not required to be published separately.
- 9 <u>(a-1)</u> If a municipality maintains an Internet website, the
- 10 municipality, instead of meeting the publication requirements
- 11 under Subsection (a), may:
- (1) publish notice in a newspaper described by
- 13 Subsection (a) once not later than the 14th day before the bid
- 14 receipt deadline; and
- 15 (2) post notice continuously on its website for at
- 16 <u>least 14 days immediately preceding the bid receipt deadline.</u>
- 17 <u>(a-2)</u> The newspaper notice under Subsection (a-1) must
- 18 include the time and place at which the bids will be publicly opened
- 19 and the website address for the procurement information.
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 262.025, Local Government Code, is
- 21 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection
- 22 (c) and (c-1) to read as follows:
- 23 (a) A notice of a proposed purchase must be published at
- 24 least once a week in a newspaper of general circulation in the
- 25 county, with the first day of publication occurring before the 14th
- 26 day before the date of the bid opening. If there is no newspaper of
- 27 general circulation in the county, the notice must be posted in a

- 1 prominent place in the courthouse for 14 days before the date of the
- 2 bid opening. In a two-step procurement process, the time and place
- 3 where the second-step bids, proposals, or responses will be
- 4 received are not required to be published separately.
- 5 (b) The notice must include:
- 6 (1) the specifications describing the item to be
- 7 purchased or a statement of where the specifications may be
- 8 obtained;
- 9 (2) the time and place at which the bids will be
- 10 publicly opened and read aloud [for receiving and opening bids] and
- 11 the name and position of the county official or employee to whom the
- 12 bids are to be sent;
- 13 (3) whether the bidder should use lump-sum or unit
- 14 pricing;
- 15 (4) the method of payment by the county; and
- 16 (5) the type of bond required by the bidder.
- 17 <u>(c) If a county maintains an Internet website, the county,</u>
- 18 instead of meeting the publication requirements under Subsection
- 19 (a), may:
- 20 (1) publish notice in a newspaper described by
- 21 Subsection (a) once not later than the 14th day before the bid
- 22 receipt deadline; and
- 23 (2) post notice continuously on its website for at
- 24 <u>least 14 days immediately preceding the bid receipt deadline.</u>
- 25 (c-1) The newspaper notice under Subsection (c) must
- 26 include the time and place at which the bids will be publicly opened
- 27 and the website address for the procurement information.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 263.153(b), Local Government Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b) The notice must be published not later than [on or
- 4 after] the 14th [30th day but before the 10th] day before the date
- 5 of the sale.
- 6 SECTION 5. Section 271.025, Local Government Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) and adding
- 8 Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The governmental entity must advertise for bids. The
- 10 advertisement for bids must include a notice that:
- 11 (1) describes the work;
- 12 (2) states the location at which the bidding
- 13 documents, plans, specifications, or other data may be examined by
- 14 all bidders; and
- 15 (3) states the time and place for submitting bids and
- 16 the time and place [that] at which the bids will be publicly opened
- 17 and read aloud.
- 18 (b) The advertisement must be published as required by law.
- 19 If no legal requirement for publication exists, the advertisement
- 20 must be published at least twice in one or more newspapers of
- 21 general circulation in the county or counties in which the work is
- 22 to be performed. The <u>first</u> [second] publication <u>of notice</u> must be
- 23 on or before the 14th [10th] day before the first date bids may be
- 24 submitted.
- 25 (b-1) If the governmental entity maintains an Internet
- 26 website, the entity, instead of meeting the publication
- 27 requirements under Subsection (b), may:

- 1 (1) publish notice in a newspaper described by
- 2 Subsection (b) once not later than the 14th day before the bid
- 3 receipt deadline; and
- 4 (2) post notice continuously on its website for at
- 5 least 14 days immediately preceding the bid receipt deadline.
- 6 (b-2) The newspaper notice under Subsection (b-1) must
- 7 include the time and place at which the bids will be publicly opened
- 8 and the website address for the procurement information.
- 9 (c) The governmental entity must provide [mail a] notice
- 10 containing the information required under Subsection (a) to any
- 11 organization that:
- 12 (1) requests in advance that notices for bids be sent
- 13 to it;
- 14 (2) agrees in writing to pay the actual cost of mailing
- 15 the notice; and
- 16 (3) certifies that it circulates notices for bids to
- 17 the construction trade in general.
- 18 (d) The governmental entity shall provide [mail a] notice
- 19 required under Subsection (c) on or before the date the first
- 20 newspaper advertisement under this section is published.
- 21 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 22 a notice required to be provided on or after September 1, 2009. A
- 23 notice required to be provided before September 1, 2009, is
- 24 governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that
- 25 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
