4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 32, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter H to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER H. COMPUTER LENDING PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 32.351. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROGRAM. The
9	commissioner by rule shall establish a computer lending pilot
10	program to provide computers to participating public schools that
11	make computers available for use by members of the local community.
12	Sec. 32.352. PILOT PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION. The
13	commissioner shall establish procedures for the administration of
14	the pilot program, including procedures for distributing to
15	participating public schools:
16	(1) any surplus or salvage data processing equipment
17	available for distribution under the pilot program; or
18	(2) computers donated or purchased for that purpose
19	with funds from any available source, including a foundation,
20	private entity, governmental entity, and institution of higher
21	education.
22	Sec. 32.353. ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS. A public school is eligible
23	to participate in the pilot program if:
24	(1) 50 percent or more of the students enrolled in the

school are educationally disadvantaged; and 1 2 (2) the school operates or agrees to operate a 3 computer lending program that: 4 (A) allows students, parents, and other area 5 residents to borrow a computer; 6 (B) includes an option for students, parents, and 7 other area residents to work toward owning a computer initially borrowed under the school's lending program, subject to any 8 applicable legal restrictions regarding disposition of 9 the 10 computer involved; (C) provides computer training for students, 11 12 parents, and other area residents; and (D) operates outside regular school hours, 13 14 including operation until at least 7 p.m. on at least three days 15 each week. Sec. 32.354. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than January 1 of each 16 17 year, the commissioner shall submit a report to the legislature regarding the computer lending pilot program established under this 18 19 subchapter. Sec. 32.355. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September 20 1, 2014. 21 SECTION 2. Section 2175.128, Government Code, is amended by 22 23 adding Subsections (a-1) and (b-1) to read as follows: 24 (a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), if a disposition of a state agency's surplus or salvage data processing equipment is not 25 26 made under Section 2175.125 or 2175.184, the state agency shall make the equipment available to the commissioner of education for 27

use in the computer lending pilot program established under 1 Subchapter H, Chapter 32, Education Code. If the commissioner of 2 education declines to take the equipment, the state agency shall 3 transfer the equipment in accordance with Subsection (a). 4 The 5 state agency may not collect a fee or other reimbursement from the 6 commissioner of education for the equipment made available under 7 this subsection. This subsection expires September 1, 2014. (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), if a disposition of 8 the surplus or salvage data processing equipment of a state 9 eleemosynary institution or an institution or agency of higher 10 education is not made under other law, the institution or agency 11 12 shall make the equipment available to the commissioner of education

for use in the computer lending pilot program established under 13 Subchapter H, Chapter 32, Education Code. If the commissioner of 14 15 education declines to take the equipment, the institution or agency shall transfer the equipment in accordance with Subsection (b). 16 17 The state eleemosynary institution or institution or agency of higher education may not collect a fee or other reimbursement from 18 the commissioner of education for the equipment made available 19 under this subsection. This subsection expires September 1, 2014. 20
