- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 521.042(c), Transportation Code, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (c) The record of a license holder who is employed as a peace
- 10 officer, fire fighter, or emergency medical services employee of
- 11 this state, a political subdivision of this state, or a special
- 12 purpose district may not include information relating to a traffic
- 13 accident that occurs [during an emergency] while the peace officer,
- 14 fire fighter, or emergency medical services employee is driving an
- 15 official vehicle in the course and scope of the license holder's
- 16 official duties.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 550.064(b), Transportation Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (b) An accident report form prepared by the department must:
- 20 (1) require sufficiently detailed information to
- 21 disclose the cause and conditions of and the persons and vehicles
- 22 involved in an accident if the form is for the report to be made by a
- 23 person involved in or investigating the accident;
- 24 (2) include a way to designate and identify a peace

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- 1 officer, firefighter, or emergency medical services employee who
- 2 [during an emergency] is involved in an accident while driving a law
- 3 enforcement vehicle, fire department vehicle, or emergency medical
- 4 services vehicle while performing the person's duties;
- 5 (3) require a statement by a person described by
- 6 Subdivision (2) as to the nature of the emergency; and
- 7 (4) include a way to designate whether an individual
- 8 involved in an accident wants to be contacted by a person seeking to
- 9 obtain employment as a professional described by Section 38.01(12),
- 10 Penal Code.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
