1-6 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the formula funding for public institutions of higher
1-9 education for certain credit hours that do not count toward a
1-10 degree.

1-11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-12 SECTION 1. Subsection (d), Section 61.0595, Education Code,
1-13 is amended to read as follows:

1-14 (d) The following are not counted for purposes of
1-15 determining whether the student has previously earned the number of
1-16 semester credit hours specified by Subsection (a):

1-17 (1) semester credit hours earned by the student before
1-18 receiving a baccalaureate degree that has previously been awarded
1-19 to the student;

1-20 (2) semester credit hours earned by the student by
1-21 examination or under any other procedure by which credit is earned
1-22 without registering for a course for which tuition is charged;

1-23 (3) credit for a remedial education course, a
1-24 technical course, a workforce education course funded according to
1-25 contact hours, or another course that does not count toward a degree
1-26 program at the institution; ~~and~~

1-27 (4) semester credit hours earned by the student at a
1-28 private institution or an out-of-state institution; and

1-29 (5) in addition to semester credit hours excluded
1-30 under another provision of this subsection, not more than 30
1-31 semester credit hours earned through one or more dual credit
1-32 courses for which the student received credit toward a high school
1-33 diploma, if those courses are identified by the board as
1-34 lower-division courses appropriate for general academic transfer
1-35 between institutions of higher education.

1-36 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
1-37 61.0595, Education Code, applies beginning with the funding
1-38 recommendations made under Section 61.059, Education Code, for the
1-39 2011-2012 academic year.

1-40 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-41 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-42 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-43 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-44 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
