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AN ACT

2 relating to intensive summer programs for public school students 3 and to college readiness programs at public institutions of higher 4 education.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 29.098, Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:

8 Sec. 29.098. INTENSIVE SUMMER PROGRAMS. (a) In this 9 section, "pilot program" means the intensive summer pilot program 10 for students identified as being at risk of dropping out of school 11 or college.

12 (b) The [From funds appropriated for that purpose, the] 13 commissioner [of education and the commissioner of higher education by rule] shall establish a pilot program to award grants to 14 participating campuses to provide intensive academic instruction 15 during the period in which school is recessed for the summer 16 [semester] to promote college and workforce readiness to students 17 identified as being at risk of dropping out of school, as defined by 18 Section 29.081 [or college]. A grant awarded under this section may 19 be used to fund any of the following categories of programs: 20

(1) [a program administered by an institution of higher education to provide intensive academic instruction in English language arts, mathematics, and science to facilitate the student's transition from high school to a postsecondary

1 institution;

[(2)] a program administered by a school district in partnership with an institution of higher education to provide intensive academic instruction in English language arts, mathematics, and science to promote high school completion and college readiness; and

7 (2) [(3)] a program administered by a school district 8 in partnership with an institution of higher education to provide 9 intensive academic instruction in reading and mathematics to 10 students in grades six through eight to promote high school 11 completion and college readiness.

12 (c) The commissioner [of education] may select for 13 participation in the pilot program only a campus that is eligible 14 under the criteria established under Section 39.358.

15 (d) [A grant may be awarded to an institution of higher 16 education for a program administered under Subsection (b)(1) only 17 if at least 50 percent of the students served in the program:

18 [(1) have a score on the Scholastic Assessment Test
19 (SAT) or American College Test (ACT) that is equal to a score less
20 than the national mean score;

21 [(2) have been awarded a grant under the federal Pell
22 grant program;

23 [(3) are at least 20 years of age on the date the 24 student initially enrolls in the institution of higher education; 25 or

26 [(4) have enrolled or will initially enroll as a 27 part-time student.

S.B. No. 2258 1 [(e) A program supported by a grant to provide intensive summer instruction under this section must: 2 [(1) provide rigorous academic instruction; 3 provide at least four weeks of instruction; and 4 [(2)][(3) for a program described by Subsection (b)(2) or 5 (3), be designed and implemented in partnership with an institution 6 7 of higher education. [(f) To the extent practicable, an institution of higher 8 9 education shall create work-study opportunities for students enrolled in teacher preparation programs to assist in providing 10 11 instruction in programs described by this section. 12 [(g)] A grant awarded under this section: 13 (1)may not exceed \$750 for each participating student; and 14 must be matched by not less than \$250 for each 15 (2) 16 participating student in other federal, state, or local funds, including private donations. 17 18 (e) [(h)] For purposes of Subsection (d)(2) [(g)(2)], a school district is encouraged to use funds allocated under Section 19 42.2516(b)(3). 20 (f) [(i)] A grant awarded under this section may not be used 21 to replace federal, state, or local funds previously spent on a 22 summer intensive program, but may be used to expand an existing 23 24 program. 25 (g) $\left[\frac{j}{j}\right]$ The entire amount of a grant awarded under this section: 26 27 (1) must fund the program described in the application

for the grant; and 1 2 (2) may be used for: (A) instructional materials; 3 4 (B) technology used primarily for the delivery of supplementary instruction; 5 6 (C) teacher training and professional 7 development, including educator stipends; and 8 (D) other necessary costs, as determined by the 9 commissioner [of education]. 10 (h) [(k)] Instructional materials adopted by the State 11 Board of Education shall be used for instruction in a program under this section [Subsection (b)(2) or (3)]. The State Board of 12 13 Education may adopt any additional instructional materials as necessary for a program under this section [Subsection (b)(2) or 14 The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt 15 (3). 16 instructional materials as necessary for students enrolled in a program under Subsection (b)(1)]. 17 (i) [(1)] The State Board of Education [and the Texas Higher 18

19 Education Coordinating Board] shall include information technology 20 instructional resources that incorporate established best 21 practices for instruction among approved instructional materials 22 for intensive summer programs under this section to enhance the 23 effectiveness of the programs.

24 SECTION 2. Section 61.0762, Education Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

26 Sec. 61.0762. PROGRAMS TO ENHANCE STUDENT SUCCESS. <u>(a)</u> To 27 implement the college readiness and success strategic action plan

1 adopted under Section 61.0761 and to enhance the success of 2 students at institutions of higher education, the board by rule 3 shall [develop]:

4 (1) <u>develop</u> [summer] higher education bridge programs
5 in the subject areas of mathematics, science, <u>social science</u>, or
6 [and] English language arts <u>to increase student success by reducing</u>
7 <u>the need for developmental education</u>;

8 (2) <u>develop</u> incentive programs for institutions of 9 higher education that implement research-based, innovative 10 developmental education initiatives;

(3) <u>develop a pilot program to award grants to</u> institutions of higher education for intensive programs designed to address the needs of students at risk of dropping out of college [financial assistance programs for educationally disadvantaged students, as defined by Section 5.001, who take college entrance and college readiness assessment instruments];

(4) <u>develop</u> professional development programs for
faculty of institutions of higher education on college readiness
standards and the implications of such standards on instruction;
and

(5) <u>develop</u> other programs as determined by the board that support the participation and success goals in "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education.

(b) The board may award a grant under Subsection (a)(3) to
 an institution of higher education only if at least 50 percent of
 the students served in the program:

27 (1) have a score on the Scholastic Assessment Test

(SAT) or American College Test (ACT) that is less than the national 1 2 mean score for that test; 3 (2) have been awarded a grant under the federal Pell 4 grant program; 5 (3) are at least 20 years of age on the date the 6 student enrolls as a first-time freshman in the institution of 7 higher education; 8 (4) have enrolled or will initially enroll as a 9 part-time student; or 10 (5) meet any other requirements established by the 11 board. SECTION 3. Section 39.363, Education Code, is amended to 12 13 read as follows: Sec. 39.363. FUNDING FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS. (a) From funds 14 appropriated, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 15 16 allocate \$8.75 million each year to establish mathematics, science, and technology teacher preparation academies under Section 21.462, 17 provide funding to the commissioner of education to [and] implement 18 and administer the program under Section 29.098, and award grants 19 20 under Section 61.0762(a)(3). The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall 21 (b) establish mathematics, science, and technology teacher preparation 22 academies under Section 21.462, provide funding to the commissioner 23 of education to [and] implement and administer the program under 24 Section 29.098, and award grants under Section 61.0762(a)(3) in a 25 manner consistent with the goals of this subchapter and the goals in 26 27 "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education.

1 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
