## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to intensive summer programs for public school students
3	and to college readiness programs at public institutions of higher
4	education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 29.098, Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 29.098. INTENSIVE SUMMER PROGRAMS. (a) The [In this
9	section, "pilot program" means the intensive summer pilot program
10	for students identified as being at risk of dropping out of school
11	or college.
12	[ <del>(b) From funds appropriated for that purpose, the</del> ]
13	commissioner [of education and the commissioner of higher education
14	by rule] shall [establish a pilot program to] award grants to
15	participating campuses to provide intensive academic instruction
16	during the period in which school is recessed for the summer
17	[semester] to promote college and workforce readiness to students
18	identified as being at risk of dropping out of school, as defined by
19	Section 29.081 [or college]. A grant awarded under this section
20	may be used to fund any of the following categories of programs:
21	(1) [ <del>a program administered by an institution of</del>
22	higher education to provide intensive academic instruction in
23	English language arts, mathematics, and science to facilitate the
24	student's transition from high school to a postsecondary

- $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$  a program administered by a school district in
- 3 partnership with an institution of higher education to provide
- 4 intensive academic instruction in English language arts,
- 5 mathematics, and science to promote high school completion and
- 6 college readiness; and
- 7 (2)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  a program administered by a school district
- 8 in partnership with an institution of higher education to provide
- 9 intensive academic instruction in reading and mathematics to
- 10 students in grades six through eight to promote high school
- 11 completion and college readiness.
- (b)  $[\frac{(c)}{(c)}]$  The commissioner  $[\frac{of\ education}{cd}]$  may select for
- 13 participation in the pilot program only a campus that is eligible
- 14 under the criteria established under Section 39.358.
- 15 <u>(c)</u> <u>(d)</u> A grant may be awarded to an institution of higher
- 16 education for a program administered under Subsection (b)(1) only
- 17 if at least 50 percent of the students served in the program:
- 18 [(1) have a score on the Scholastic Assessment Test
- 19 (SAT) or American College Test (ACT) that is equal to a score less
- 20 than the national mean score;
- 21 [(2) have been awarded a grant under the federal Pell
- 22 grant program;
- [(3) are at least 20 years of age on the date the
- 24 student initially enrolls in the institution of higher education;
- 25 <del>or</del>
- 26 [(4) have enrolled or will initially enroll as a
- 27 part-time student.

- [(e) A program supported by a grant to provide intensive 1 summer instruction under this section must: 2 (1) provide rigorous academic instruction; 3 [(2) provide at least four weeks of instruction; and 4 5 [(3) for a program described by Subsection (b)(2) or (3), be designed and implemented in partnership with an institution 6 7 of higher education. 8 [(f) To the extent practicable, an institution of higher education shall create work-study opportunities for students 10 enrolled in teacher preparation programs to assist in providing instruction in programs described by this section. 11 12  $\left[\frac{g}{g}\right]$  A grant awarded under this section: may not exceed \$750 for each participating 13 (1)14 student; and
- 15 (2) must be matched by not less than \$250 for each
- 16 participating student in other federal, state, or local funds,
- 17 including private donations.
- 18 (d) [(h)] For purposes of Subsection (c)(2) [(g)(2)], a
- 19 school district is encouraged to use funds allocated under Section
- 20 42.2516(b)(3).
- 21  $\underline{\text{(e)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(i)}}{\text{)}}$ ] A grant awarded under this section may not be used
- 22 to replace federal, state, or local funds previously spent on a
- 23 summer intensive program, but may be used to expand an existing
- 24 program.
- 25  $\underline{\text{(f)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(j)}}{\text{)}}$ ] The entire amount of a grant awarded under this
- 26 section:
- 27 (1) must fund the program described in the application

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1 for the grant; and
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- 2 (2) may be used for:
- 3 (A) instructional materials;
- 4 (B) technology used primarily for the delivery of
- 5 supplementary instruction;
- 6 (C) teacher training and professional
- 7 development, including educator stipends; and
- 8 (D) other necessary costs, as determined by the
- 9 commissioner [of education].
- 10 (g) [<del>(k)</del>] Instructional materials adopted by the State
- 11 Board of Education shall be used for instruction in a program under
- 12 this section [Subsection (b)(2) or (3)]. The State Board of
- 13 Education may adopt any additional instructional materials as
- 14 necessary for a program under this section [Subsection (b)(2) or
- 15 (3). The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may adopt
- 16 instructional materials as necessary for students enrolled in a
- 17 program under Subsection (b)(1)].
- (h) [<del>(1)</del>] The State Board of Education [<del>and the Texas Higher</del>
- 19 Education Coordinating Board] shall include information technology
- 20 instructional resources that incorporate established best
- 21 practices for instruction among approved instructional materials
- 22 for intensive summer programs under this section to enhance the
- 23 effectiveness of the programs.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.0762, Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0762. PROGRAMS TO ENHANCE STUDENT SUCCESS. (a) To
- 27 implement the college readiness and success strategic action plan

- 1 adopted under Section 61.0761 and to enhance the success of
- 2 students at institutions of higher education, the board by rule
- 3 shall [develop]:
- 4 (1) <u>develop</u> [summer] higher education bridge programs
- 5 in the subject areas of mathematics, science, social science, or
- 6 [and] English language arts to increase student success by reducing
- 7 the need for developmental education;
- 8 (2) develop incentive programs for institutions of
- 9 higher education that implement research-based, innovative
- 10 developmental education initiatives;
- 11 (3) award grants to institutions of higher education
- 12 for intensive programs designed to address the needs of students at
- 13 risk of dropping out of college [financial assistance programs for
- 14 educationally disadvantaged students, as defined by Section 5.001,
- 15 who take college entrance and college readiness assessment
- 16 instruments];
- 17 (4) develop professional development programs for
- 18 faculty of institutions of higher education on college readiness
- 19 standards and the implications of such standards on instruction;
- 20 and
- 21 (5) <u>develop</u> other programs as determined by the board
- 22 that support the participation and success goals in "Closing the
- 23 Gaps," the state's master plan for higher education.
- 24 (b) The board may award a grant under Subsection (a)(3) to
- 25 an institution of higher education only if at least 50 percent of
- 26 the students served in the program:
- 27 (1) have a score on the Scholastic Assessment Test

- 1 (SAT) or American College Test (ACT) that is less than the national
- 2 mean score for that test;
- 3 (2) have been awarded a grant under the federal Pell
- 4 grant program;
- 5 (3) are at least 20 years of age on the date the
- 6 student enrolls as a first-time freshman in the institution of
- 7 <u>higher education;</u>
- 8 <u>(4) have enrolled or will initially enroll as a</u>
- 9 part-time student; or
- 10 (5) meet any other requirements established by the
- 11 board.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 39.363, Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 39.363. FUNDING FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS. (a) From funds
- 15 appropriated, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 16 allocate \$8.75 million each year to establish mathematics, science,
- 17 and technology teacher preparation academies under Section 21.462,
- 18 [and] implement and administer the program under Section 29.098,
- and award grants under Section 61.0762(a)(3).
- 20 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 21 establish mathematics, science, and technology teacher preparation
- 22 academies under Section 21.462 $_{\underline{\prime}}$  [and] implement and administer the
- 23 program under Section 29.098, and award grants under Section
- 24 61.0762(a)(3) in a manner consistent with the goals of this
- 25 subchapter and the goals in "Closing the Gaps," the state's master
- 26 plan for higher education.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
