AN ACT

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 341.0357(b), Health and Safety Code, as 6 added by Chapter 861 (H.B. 1391), Acts of the 80th Legislature, 7 Regular Session, 2007, is amended to read as follows:

8 (b) The regulatory authority for a public utility shall by 9 rule or ordinance adopt standards for <u>installing fire hydrants and</u> 10 maintaining sufficient water pressure for service to fire hydrants 11 adequate to protect public safety in residential areas in a 12 municipality with a population of 1,000,000 or more.

13 SECTION 2. Section 341.0358(b), Health and Safety Code, is 14 amended to read as follows:

(b) The regulatory authority for a public utility shall by rule or ordinance adopt standards for <u>installing fire hydrants and</u> maintaining sufficient water pressure for service to fire hydrants adequate to protect public safety in residential areas in a municipality with a population of 1,000,000 or more.

SECTION 3. 3 (b) Section 2 of this Act takes effect only if the Act of the 4 81st Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, relating to 5 nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in existing codes 6 (H.B. ______ or S.B. ____) becomes law. If the Act of the 81st 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2009, relating to nonsubstantive 8 additions to and corrections in existing codes (H.B. _____ or S.B. ____) 9 does not become law, Section 2 of this Act has no effect.
