A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to eligibility for an award through the Early High School
- 3 Graduation Scholarship program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 56.203, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (e) and adding Subsection (f) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (a) To be eligible for an award through the Early High
- 9 School Graduation Scholarship program, a person must:
- 10 (1) have graduated from a public high school in this
- 11 state:
- 12 (A) in not more than 41 consecutive months and
- 13 successfully completed the recommended or advanced high school
- 14 program established under Section 28.025, if the person graduated
- 15 on or after September 1, 2005;
- 16 (B) in not more than 46 consecutive months, with
- 17 at least 30 hours of college credit, and successfully completed the
- 18 recommended or advanced high school program established under
- 19 Section 28.025, if the person graduated on or after September 1,
- 20 2005; or
- (C) in not more than 36 consecutive months after
- 22 successfully completing the requirements for a high school diploma,
- 23 if the person graduated before September 1, 2005, regardless of
- 24 whether the person successfully completed the recommended or

- 1 advanced high school program established under Section 28.025;
- 2 (2) have attended one or more public high schools in
- 3 this state for the majority of time the person attended high school,
- 4 except as provided by Subsection (f); and
- 5 (3) <u>except as provided by Subsection (f)</u>, be a citizen
- 6 of the United States or otherwise lawfully authorized to be present
- 7 in the United States.
- 8 (e) The coordinating board shall adopt rules for
- 9 determining whether a person attended public high school in this
- 10 state as required by Subsection (a)(2) and for determining under
- 11 Subsection (f)(2) whether a person attended a high school other
- 12 than a public high school in this state primarily because of the
- 13 migratory agricultural or fishing work of the person, the person's
- 14 parent, or the person's spouse. The coordinating board may adopt
- 15 other rules the board considers necessary for the administration of
- 16 <u>Subsection (f)</u>.
- 17 (f) A person described by Subsection (a)(1)(A) or (B) who is
- 18 otherwise eligible for an award and who is a migratory child, as
- 19 defined by 20 U.S.C. Section 6399, is eligible for an award through
- 20 the Early High School Graduation Scholarship program despite the
- 21 <u>student's inability to satisfy Subsection (a)(2) or (3) if:</u>
- 22 (1) the person graduates from a public high school in
- 23 this state; and
- (2) the person attended one or more high schools,
- 25 other than a public high school in this state, for one or more
- 26 periods primarily because of the migratory agricultural or fishing
- 27 work of the person, the person's parent, or the person's spouse, and

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- 1 the person would have satisfied Subsection (a)(2) if the person had
- 2 attended a public high school in this state during that period or
- 3 those periods.
- 4 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a student who graduates from a public high school in this state on
- 6 or after the effective date of this Act. A student who graduates
- 7 from a public high school in this state before the effective date of
- 8 this Act and the student's eligibility to participate in the Early
- 9 High School Graduation Scholarship program is governed by the law
- 10 in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the
- 11 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
