A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT 2 relating to the composition, duties, and expenses of certain 3 entities created to study and provide advice regarding 4 environmental flows.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subsection (e), Section 11.0236, Water Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (e) The <u>lieutenant governor shall designate an</u> appointed 9 senator [with the most seniority] and <u>the speaker of the house of</u> 10 <u>representatives shall designate an</u> [the] appointed house member <u>to</u> 11 [with the most seniority] serve together as co-presiding officers 12 of the advisory group.

SECTION 2. Section 11.02361, Water Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:

16 (a) The Texas environmental flows science advisory
17 committee consists of at least five but not more than nine members
18 appointed by the <u>board</u> [advisory group].

(b) The <u>board</u> [advisory group] shall appoint to the science advisory committee persons who will provide an objective perspective and diverse technical expertise, including expertise in hydrology, hydraulics, water resources, aquatic and terrestrial biology, geomorphology, geology, water quality, computer modeling, and other technical areas pertinent to the evaluation of

environmental flows. 1 2 (b-1) In making an appointment under this section, the board shall ensure that the appointee to the science advisory committee 3 is not disqualified from service on the committee under provisions 4 of state law that apply to such appointees, including provisions 5 regarding conflicts of interest. 6 7 (c) Members of the science advisory committee serve five-year terms expiring March 1. A vacancy on the science advisory 8 9 committee is filled by appointment by the board [co-presiding officers of the advisory group] for the unexpired term. 10

SECTION 3. Section 11.02362, Water Code, is amended by amending Subsections (c), (d), (f), and (g) and adding Subsections (f-1) and (i-1) to read as follows:

14 (c) For the river basin and bay systems listed in Subsection15 (b)(1):

16 (1) the advisory group shall appoint the basin and bay
17 area stakeholders committee not later than November 1, 2007;

18 (2) the basin and bay area stakeholders committee
19 shall establish a basin and bay expert science team not later than
20 March 1, 2008;

(3) the basin and bay expert science team shall finalize environmental flow regime recommendations and submit them to the basin and bay area stakeholders committee, the advisory group, and the commission not later than <u>December 1</u> [March 1], 2009, except that at the request of the basin and bay area stakeholders committee for good cause shown, the advisory group may extend the deadline provided by this subdivision;

1 (4) the basin and bay area stakeholders committee 2 shall submit to the commission its comments on and recommendations 3 regarding the basin and bay expert science team's recommended 4 environmental flow regime not later than <u>June 1, 2010</u> [September 1, 5 <u>2009</u>]; and

6 (5) the commission shall adopt the environmental flow 7 standards as provided by Section 11.1471 not later than <u>June 1, 2011</u> 8 [<u>September 1, 2010</u>].

9 (d) The advisory group shall appoint the basin and bay area stakeholders committees for the river basin and bay systems listed 10 in Subsection (b)(2) not later than June 1, 2009 [September 1, 11 2008], and shall appoint the basin and bay area stakeholders 12 committees for the river basin and bay systems listed in Subsection 13 (b)(3) not later than June 1, 2010 [September 1, 2009]. 14 The 15 advisory group shall establish a schedule for the performance of 16 the tasks listed in Subsections (c)(2) through (5) with regard to the river basin and bay systems listed in Subsections (b)(2) and (3) 17 that will result in the adoption of environmental flow standards 18 for that river basin and bay system by the commission as soon as is 19 20 reasonably possible. Each basin and bay area stakeholders committee and basin and bay expert science team for a river basin 21 and bay system listed in Subsection (b)(2) or (3) shall make 22 recommendations to the advisory group with regard to the schedule 23 24 applicable to that river basin and bay system. The advisory group 25 shall consider the recommendations of the basin and bay area stakeholders committee and basin and bay expert science team as 26 27 well as coordinate with, and give appropriate consideration to the

recommendations of, the commission, the Parks and Wildlife 1 2 Department, and the board in establishing the schedule.

(f) The board [advisory group] shall appoint a basin and bay 3 area stakeholders committee for each river basin and bay system in 4 this state for which a schedule for the development 5 of environmental flow regime recommendations and the adoption of 6 7 environmental flow standards is specified by or established under Subsection (c), (d), or (e). Chapter 2110, Government Code, does 8 9 not apply to the size, composition, or duration of a basin and bay 10 area stakeholders committee. Each committee must consist of at least 17 members. The membership of each committee must: 11

(1) reflect a fair and equitable balance of interest 12 groups concerned with the particular river basin and bay system for 13 which the committee is established; and 14

15 (2) be representative of appropriate stakeholders, including the following if they have a presence in the particular 16 river basin and bay system for which the committee is established: 17

agricultural 18 (A) water users, including representatives of each of the following sectors: 19

20 (i) agricultural irrigation; (ii) free-range livestock; and 21 22 (iii) concentrated animal feeding 23 operation; recreational water users, including coastal 24 (B) 25 recreational anglers and businesses supporting water recreation;

(C) municipalities; 26

(D)

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soil and water conservation districts;

1 (E) industrial water including users, 2 representatives of each of the following sectors: (i) refining; 3 4 (ii) chemical manufacturing; (iii) electricity generation; and 5 6 (iv) production of paper products or 7 timber; (F) commercial fishermen; 8 9 (G) public interest groups; 10 regional water planning groups; (H) 11 (I) groundwater conservation districts; river authorities and other conservation and 12 (J) 13 reclamation districts with jurisdiction over surface water; and 14 (K) environmental interests. 15 (f-1) In appointing a member to a basin and bay area 16 stakeholders committee, the board shall ensure that the appointee is not disqualified from service on the committee under provisions 17 of state law that apply to such appointees, including provisions 18 regarding conflicts of interest. 19 Members of a basin and bay area stakeholders committee 20 (g) 21 serve five-year terms expiring March 1. On the expiration of a 22 member's term, the board shall make an appointment to the committee in accordance with Subsections (f) and (f-1). If a vacancy occurs 23 on a committee, the remaining members of the committee by majority 24 25 vote shall appoint a member to serve the remainder of the unexpired 26 term. 27 (i-1) In appointing a member to a basin and bay expert

1 science team, the basin and bay area stakeholders committee shall 2 ensure that the appointee is not disqualified from service on the 3 team under provisions of state law that apply to such appointees, 4 including provisions regarding conflicts of interest.

5 SECTION 4. Section 15.4063, Water Code, is amended to read 6 as follows:

Sec. 15.4063. ENVIRONMENTAL FLOWS FUNDING. The board may
authorize the use of money in the research and planning fund:

9 (1) to compensate the members of the Texas 10 environmental flows science advisory committee established under 11 Section 11.02361 for attendance and participation at meetings of the committee and for transportation, meals, lodging, or other 12 13 travel expenses other than out-of-state travel expenses associated with attendance at those meetings as provided by the General 14 15 Appropriations Act;

16 (2) for contracts with cooperating state and federal 17 agencies and universities and with private entities as necessary to 18 provide technical assistance to enable the Texas environmental 19 flows science advisory committee and the basin and bay expert 20 science teams established under Section 11.02362 to perform their 21 statutory duties;

(3) to compensate the members of the basin and bay expert science teams established under Section 11.02362 for attendance and participation at meetings of the basin and bay expert science teams and for transportation, meals, lodging, or other travel expenses <u>other than out-of-state travel expenses</u> associated with attendance at those meetings as provided by the

1 General Appropriations Act; and

2 (4) for contracts with political subdivisions 3 designated as representatives of basin and bay area stakeholders 4 committees established under Section 11.02362 to fund all or part 5 of the administrative expenses incurred in conducting meetings of 6 the basin and bay area stakeholders committees or the pertinent 7 basin and bay expert science teams.

SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections 8 9 11.02361 and 11.02362, Water Code, in the appointment and 10 qualifications of members of the Texas environmental flows science 11 advisory committee, a basin and bay area stakeholders committee, and a basin and bay expert science team do not affect the 12 entitlement of a member serving on a committee or team immediately 13 before the effective date of this Act to continue to serve and 14 function as a member of the committee or team for the remainder of 15 16 the member's term. Those changes in law apply only to a member appointed on or after the effective date of this Act. 17

18 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
